

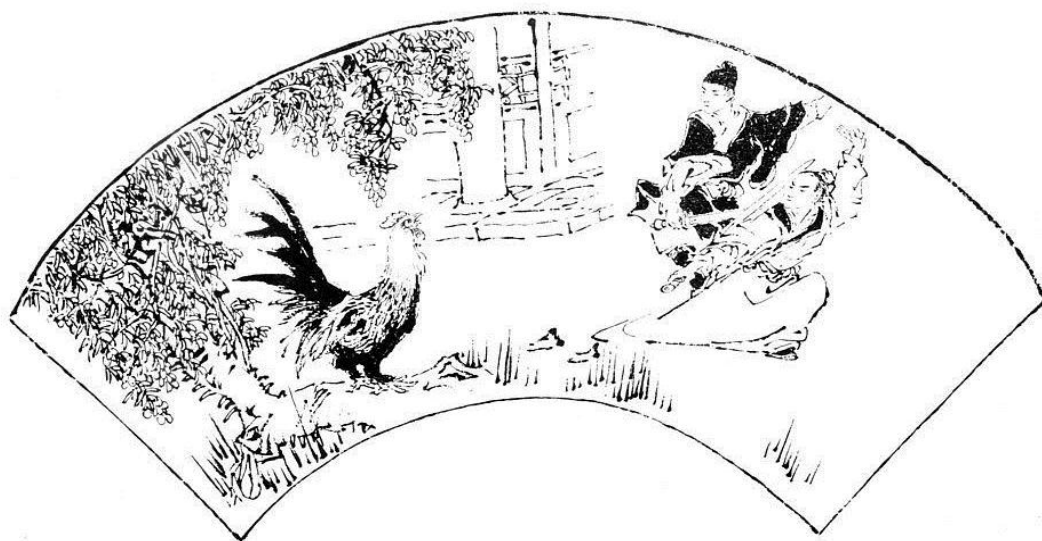
## 闻鸡起舞

后来祖逖被封为镇西将军，刘琨做了都督，两人终于实现了报效国家的愿望。



聞雞起舞 出自《晉書·祖逖傳》：“與司空劉琨俱爲司州主簿，情好綢繆，共被同寢。中夜聞荒鷄鳴，琨琨覺曰：‘此非惡聲也，因起舞。’”祖逖，東晉名將，愛國志士，被晉元帝任爲豫州刺史，率軍抗擊匈奴，渡江時曾擊楫發誓，收復中原失地。劉琨，西晉將領，少時與祖逖爲友。他倆志同道合，感情很好，常常相互勉勵。半夜鷄啼，一直被古人認爲不祥之兆，而他們聽到鷄叫却立即起身練習武藝，發奮鍛鍊。後人便以“聞雞起舞”比喻志士及時奮發。

## Rise upon hearing a rooster crow to practice fencing

One night, Zu Ti was wakened up by cockcrow from distance. And he woke Liu Kun up. Liu Kun said "So noisy. Why does the rooster crow so offensive?" Zu Ti said "I, on the contrary, feel like the crow. It is urging us to get up and practice swordplay. We can't render service to the state without good health." "You are right" said Liu Kun, "From now on, we must get up and practice swordplay when the rooster crow. No one can laze away." On this account, Zu Ti and Liu Kun everyday persisted in getting up early and practice swordplay as soon as the rooster crow. Year by year they never quit. After long-term assiduous study and practice, they became talents of both civil and military ability.

Later, Zu Ti was conferred the title of Zhenxi General and Liu Kun became a military governor. The two realized their ambition to serve the state.
