Securing against threats, vulnerabilities and uncertainty? Towards the organization of risk management and regulation analysis hijacked by business groups

An international gathering of leading academics, politicians, company directors, and industry professionals will be addressing current issues and controversies in risk management and regulatory regimes at the London School of Economics on the 22nd and 23rd of March.

Speakers from the London School of Economics, Oxford, Harvard, Columbia and other prestigious institutions will be joined by representatives from the Financial Services Authority, the Health and Safety Executive, the National Audit Office, and the Cabinet Office in debating the organization of regulatory regimes for the management and mitigation of risk in relation to topics as diverse as international terrorism, financial markets, workplace safety and public health at a conference hosted by the Centre for the Analysis of Risk and Regulation.

The conference will consider questions of preparedness, resilience, trust and reputation in view of the threats, vulnerabilities and uncertainties that confront modern states, societies, economies and organizations.
