

- Need to account more for complexity and potential side-effects
- Need to consult more
- Need to understand markets more

Tensions in the regulatory state

- centralised vs decentralised
- codified vs discretionary
- 'competition' vs jurisdictional expansion/ overlapping policy agendas
- 'autonomy' vs media opinion & political responsiveness, risk aversion & institutional blame engineering

- Crisis II: How can regulation avoid being a source of crisis?
- Crisis III: When regulation doesn't work more 'rationality' may not be the answer; how can capacity and motivation (reputation) be accounted for?
