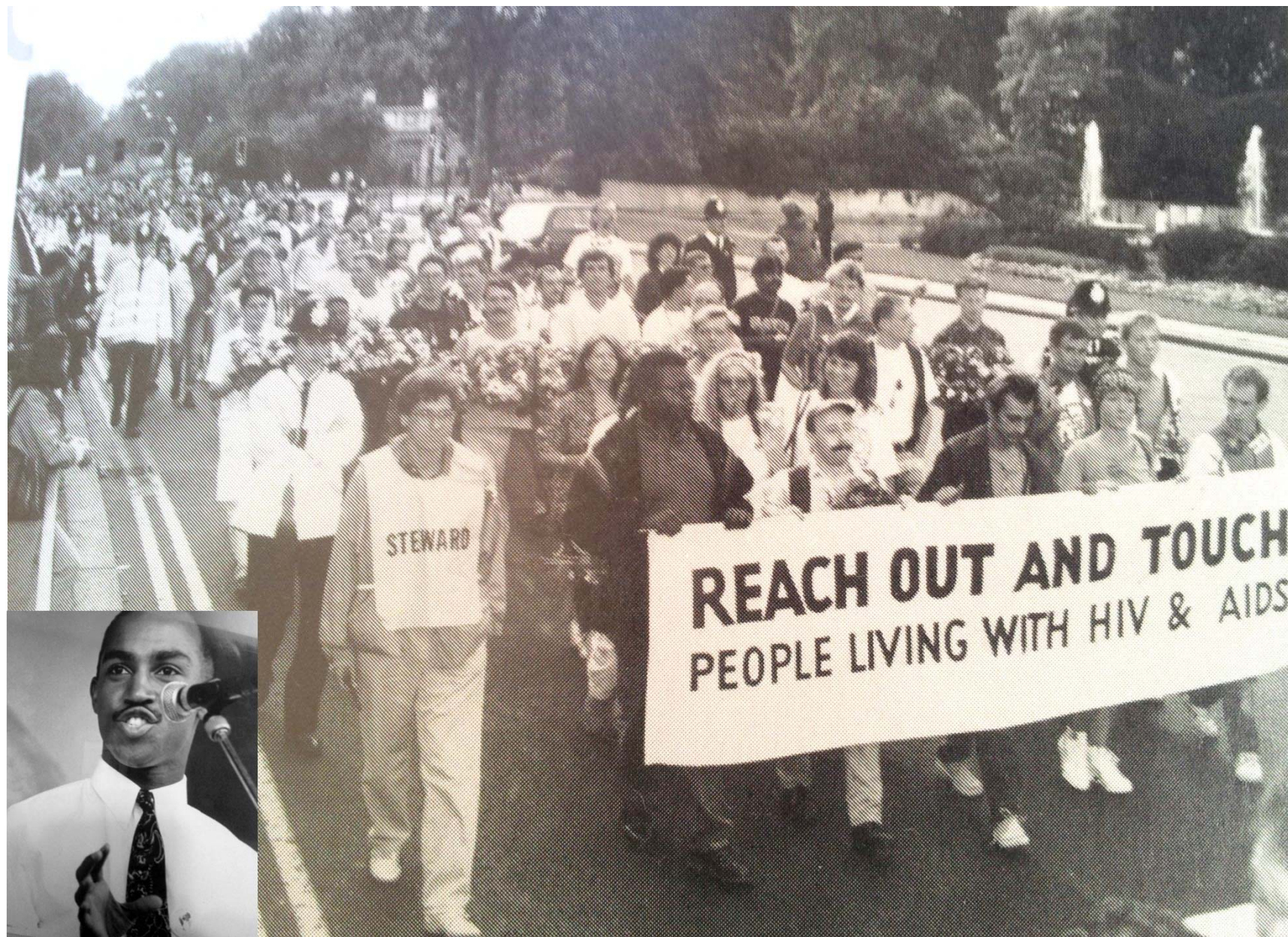

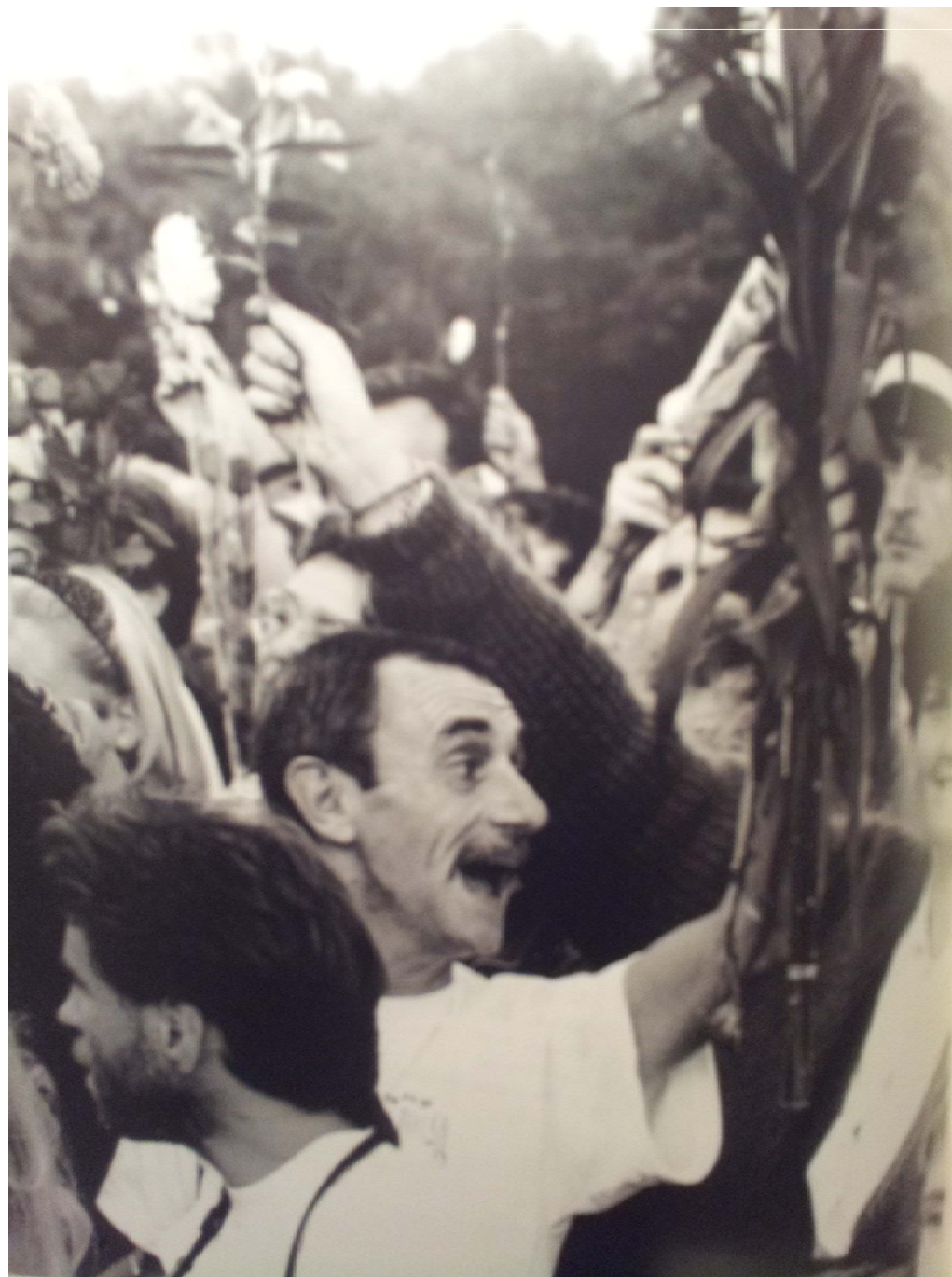






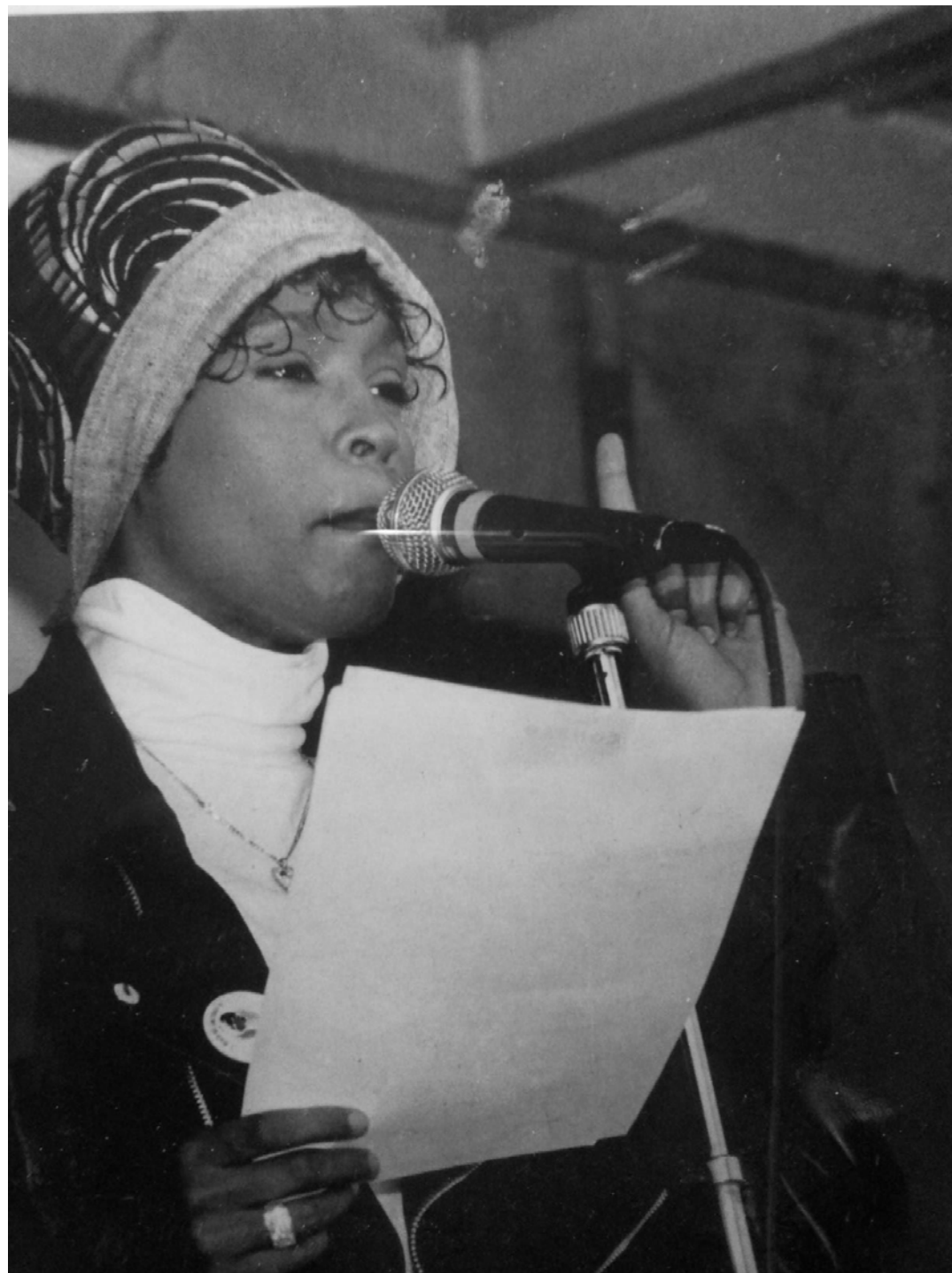

We have to beat Aids stigma, says Whitney



AMERICAN singer Whitney Houston opened a Hyde Park rally of HIV and Aids victims yesterday with a powerful condemnation of the stigma surrounding sufferers. Whitney, dressed in a black and black 80s jeans, leaned on to the stage, smiling broadly and said: "I am honoured to have been asked to open this event. Sadly, there is a stigma associated with those who have Aids. Our world must continue to work, through research, towards finding a cure." Miss Houston, recently "outed" in America by gay activists as being gay, was supporting a new campaign aimed at removing what sufferers see as the fear and isolation which attend suffering from the disease. Called "Reach Out and Touch People with HIV and Aids" the event - was attended by around 1,000 flag and flower waving people of all ages. Other speakers included singer Ruby Turner, London's Burning star Treva Elmore and Thelma Houston. The event's coordinator, Vernal Scott, of the Great HIV Centre, revealed that about 17,000 people in the UK know they have HIV. He said around 3,000 people had gone on to

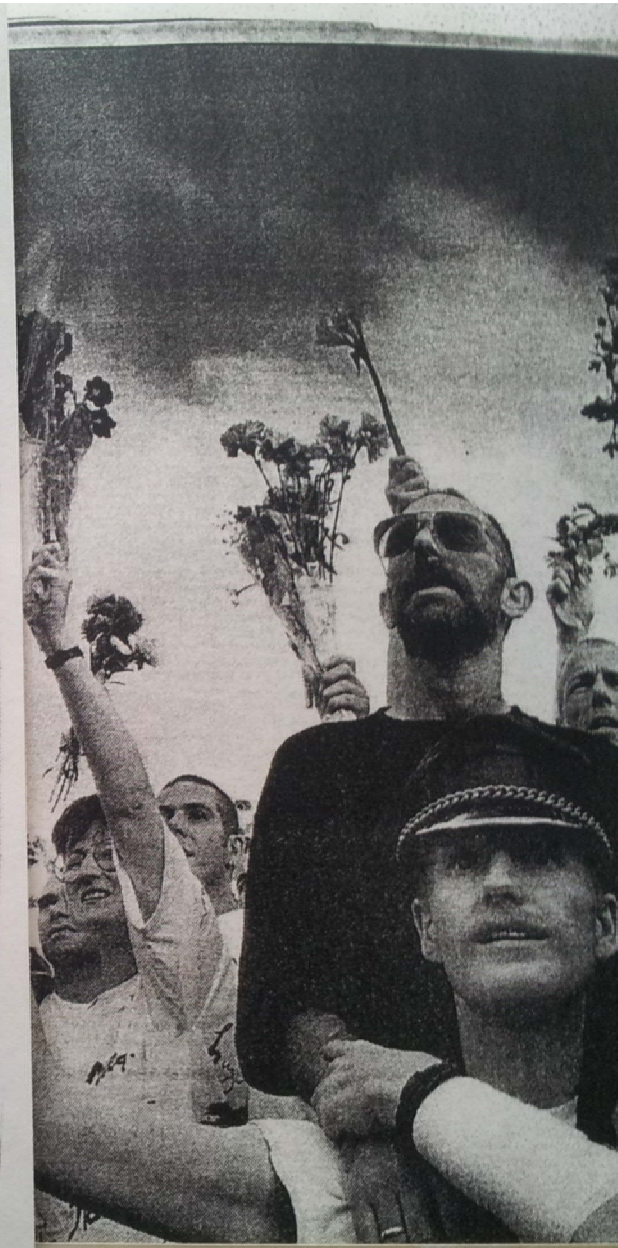
