Human Rights organizations played a crucial role in the return of Democracy to Argentina 25 years ago. With the reestablishment of the rule of law and the democratic process, both state and society have committed themselves to unveil the truth in all its horror on the violations of human rights by the military government (1976-1983).

The Argentine Forensic Anthropology Team, (Equipo Argentino de Anthropologia Forense, EAAF), established in 1984, is a nongovernmental, nonprofit, scientific organization that applies forensic sciences, mainly forensic anthropology, archeology, and genetics, to the investigation of human rights violations in Argentina and around the world. The team was founded in response to the need to investigate the disappearances of at least 9,000 people by the military regime that ruled Argentina from 1976 to 1983.
