“Arbitration and Financial Markets Disputes”

with Jeffrey Golden & Jan Paulsson

The International Swaps and Derivatives Association, Inc. (ISDA) is currently considering the enhanced use of arbitration in the context of an ISDA Master Agreement (see [here](#)). On the other hand, there are still numerous reservations and open questions regarding a future generalised use of arbitration in the field, which have been voice in a powerful paper (see [here](#)) by *Jeffrey Golden*, the principal author of ISDA’s Master agreements and the driving force behind the efforts of setting up an international financial court (see, e.g., [here](#)). In this second LSE Arbitration Debate, which is a joint event of the [Transnational Law Project](#) and the [Law & Financial Markets Project](#), *Jan Paulsson* will take on Jeff’s question marks about arbitration not being as suitable as a world court for financial markets disputes.

Jeffrey Golden is Visiting Professor at the LSE Law Department and was the founding partner of the U.S. law practice of Allen & Overy LLP and a senior partner in the firm’s global derivatives practice.

Jan Paulsson is LSE Centennial Professor and co-head of the international arbitration and public international law groups of Freshfields LLP.
