First year courses EC100 and EC102

The Department of Economics offers two first year economics courses: Economics A (EC100) and Economics B (EC102). Both are excellent courses that fully prepare students for the rigorous second year microeconomics and macroeconomics courses.

EC100 is designed for those of you who do not have A Level Economics or equivalent, while EC102 is for those of you who do have A Level Economics or equivalent. This split ensures that the EC100 lecturers cover A Level material in sufficient depth, while allowing the EC102 lecturers to spend somewhat less time on A Level material and instead present a broader view of the topics. Neither course requires calculus or heavy use of maths and both are equally challenging.

You will be automatically assigned to either EC100 or EC102 depending on whether you have A Level Economics or equivalent. 
Introducing Your First Year Tutor
