The 2008 *Economica* Phillips Lecture, hosted jointly by *Economica* and the Department of Economics, is the first in a new lecture series named to reflect the authorship of one of the most famous articles ever published in *Economica* (the 'Phillips Curve' article, published 50 years ago this year, was the most heavily-cited macroeconomics title of the 20th century). The inaugural lecture, entitled 'Schooling and Growth', will be given by Robert Lucas, the John Dewey Distinguished Service Professor in Economics at the University of Chicago. One of the world's leading authorities on monetary theory, growth and development, he was awarded the Nobel Prize for Economics in 1995.

Following this year's inaugural lecture The *Economica* Phillips lecture will be given every other year, in rotation with the *Economica* Coase lecture series (after Ronald Coase's celebrated work on the theory of the firm which began with his *Economica* article), which was inaugurated in 2007.
