## Author's Guidelines<sup>1</sup>

Papers should be submitted in PDF format. The first page must include the author's name, affiliation, contact details and an abstract:

### Word Limit:

There is no maximum or minimum word limit for submitted papers

### Fonts:

- Times New Roman
- Font size: 12
- Line spacing: 1.5

### Sections Titles:

- No title may be alone on the page; some text must exist beneath it
- Title: Times New Roman, 12pt **Bold**, two spaces above, one below
- Subtitles: Times New Roman, 12 pt, *Italics*, One space above, one below
