

MANUAL OF STYLE

The European Journal of Women's Studies (EJWS) is an interdisciplinary, academic journal devoted to European feminist scholarship.

- *Interdisciplinary*: contributions span a range of disciplines in the humanities and social sciences and are of interest to a broad, interdisciplinary readership. Different theoretical and methodological perspectives are welcome.
- *Academic*: high quality scholarship at the cutting edge of women's studies research and feminist theory.
- *European*: focus on European scholarship, reflecting differences within Europe between North and South, East and West, as well as situating European feminist scholarship in a transnational context.
- *Feminist*: represents the latest strand of gender theory and feminist scholarship
- internationally, contributing to feminist debates from a European perspective.

Contributions to the journal can take several forms:

- a regular article. **Maximum length 6000-7000 words, including notes and references. This length is strictly adhered to.**
- Open Forum. A short position paper or essay, aimed at generating discussion. Max. length 3000 words.
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2. Type **double-spaced** throughout (notes and references too!) on one side of A4 or American Quarto paper with generous margins on all sides. All pages should be numbered.

3. Each paper should be accompanied by the following information on a separate sheet:

- cover sheet with full author name, titles, affiliation, institutional address, telephone and fax numbers, e-mail (if any).
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4. Tables should have an explanatory caption and be presented on a separate sheet at the end of the paper. Check that each table is cited in the text. For Figures counts the same as for tables. If possible, figures should be supplied electronically as

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
