Summary of relevant information related to disability:

Paddington was assessed in April 2009 during the 2nd year of his undergraduate studies. He was found to have dyspraxia.

Paddington has great strengths in language and verbal areas, and his vocabulary is exceptionally good, with superior verbal reasoning and general knowledge.

The impact of his dyspraxia results from visual processing speed and working memory difficulties. This can mean that interpreting visually presented material such as graphs can be difficult. In discussions, he can find it hard to process auditory information quickly enough to produce responses which fully represent his understanding. He experiences some motor co-ordination difficulties which affect the speed and legibility of his handwriting.
