

Student disciplinary, grievance and appeals cases (2011/12)

Disciplinary and grievances

- 5 disciplinary cases: one each for theft, plagiarism, public disorder, sexism and bringing the School into disrepute (for reasons of racial offence)
- 2 complaints on an academic matter (1 upheld, 1 rejected)
- 1 harassment case (not upheld)
- 1 appeal against 4 complaints heard by the Students' Union (partly upheld)
- 1 administrative service complaint (upheld)

No attempt has been made to analyse this data as the statistics are too small to support any theories of trends.

Assessment Misconduct

- 16 cases of exam misconduct
- 23 cases of plagiarism

Appeals

Academic appeals are consistently the most numerous type of cases which the School has to deal with each academic year, although there has been no obvious trend detected in the context of equality and diversity matters.

- 95 appeals, of which 9 related to declared disabilities

Of these 9 cases, only 3 have been concluded to date; in all cases the appeal was rejected.
