## LSE reveals architects behind £90m building designs

Winning RSHP bid also topped public poll

Rogers Stirk Harbour & Partners' winning design for a new building for the LSE was the top choice in a public poll of staff, students and visitors.

The LSE has now matched the names of the practices to the images of their proposals for its new £90 million Global Centre for Social Sciences in central London.



#### Grafton Architects' London School of Economics Global Centre for Social Sciences proposal

The RSHP plan scored 38% of the 575 votes cost with Hopkins second on 112 votes – just over half of what Rogers scored – and OMA in third on 106 votes. The LSE said it had taken into consideration the result of the public poll with its decision.

Heneghan Peng and Grafton Architects were bottom with 69 and 68 votes respectively.
