

LSE Faith Centre Covenant

The LSE Faith Centre exists:

1. to support the different faith groups on campus in their communal life and religious observance and
2. to promote respectful and cohesive relations between all members of the LSE community.

Its activities are overseen by the Interfaith Forum which is made up of all those LSESU faith societies who, agreeing to this covenant, are entitled to use the space to hold their events and store their equipment.

The society officers who make up the Interfaith Forum will encourage all their members to:

- Respect all users of the Faith Centre, treating all individuals with dignity and compassion regardless of their religion or beliefs.
- Commit themselves to engaging cooperatively in the life of the Centre, not compromising their own beliefs but recognising the need to foster good relations with others.
- Bring any issues of conflict or tension to the Forum in spirit of honesty and desire for reconciliation.
- Refrain from using the communal spaces of the Centre as a space to proselytise for their religion or beliefs.

As a practical expression of these principles, members will:

- Leave all spaces as they found them after use, ready for the next group.
- Refrain from disrupting other groups' meetings, particularly those of a meditative or devotional nature.
- Respect decisions that the Interfaith Adviser may need to take, after due consideration, about room booking priorities.
- Accept that repeated breach of these principles may result in suspended privileges.
