## Policy for Faith Centre bookings

The LSE Faith Centre is a multi-faith facility for all staff and students of all faiths and none. The Centre is under the oversight of the Chaplain, the Faith Centre Coordinator and Faith Centre Advisory Board.

The Centre is not part of the main LSE room bookings system and is set aside for

- Personal prayer, meditation or reflection by staff and students
- Meetings of LSE student faith societies
- Staff faith/wellbeing associations (e.g. yoga, Pentecostal network)
- Events and activities organised by the Faith Centre itself

Student societies should be aware that events that they wish to open to the non-society members or to the general public should go through the LSE room bookings system and would not ordinarily be held in the Faith Centre.

To be eligible to book the Faith Centre, student groups must meet the following criteria:

1. The faith group should be a registered LSE Student's Union Faith Society.  
This is to avoid external religious groups using the Centre as a base for recruitment or exploiting free room hire.
2. The faith society should apply for admission to the LSE Interfaith Forum.  
This is to ensure commitment to the principles of respect and dialogue that foster good campus relations. It gives each faith society a stake in decision-making and conflict resolution in the ongoing life of the Centre and wider university life.  
To join the Interfaith Forum each society is asked to submit a summary of its aims and ethos which is circulated to existing members. Current members of the Forum may raise objections and these will be considered.
3. The president of the society should sign the Faith Centre Covenant.  
The Covenant is a sign of good will, committing each faith society to promoting respectful use of the space and treatment of others within it. It seeks to ensure the Centre remains a "safe space" for all users, prohibiting proselytism and addressing other practical issues such as storage and timetable conflicts.

Events organised by the Faith Centre itself are subject to the same policies as events organised by the School.

Any complaints about the implementation of this policy should be addressed to the Chaplain in the first instance.
