LSE Staff: Photocopying and scanning under the CLA Higher Education Licence

The LSE hold a licence from the Copyright Licensing Agency (CLA) that permits multiple copying of limited extracts from printed books journals, magazines for use by students and the course tutor on registered taught courses and non-credit bearing short courses.

Copying is limited to:

- One whole chapter from a book
- One whole article from a journal issue
- A short story or poem (not exceeding 10 pages in length) from an anthology
- One whole paper from a set of conference proceedings
- One whole report of a single case from a volume of judicial proceedings
- Or 5 per cent of any of the above, whichever is the greater.

Materials should be distributed with strict reference to a specific **Course of Study** and not made more widely available.

Photocopying

The material licensed for photocopying consists of books, journals, magazines and other periodicals published:

- In the United Kingdom **and**
- In the 'International Territories' currently consisting of Argentina, Australia, Austria, Barbados, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hong Kong, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Luxembourg, Mexico, The Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Singapore, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Taiwan (ROC), Trinidad and Tobago and the United States of America (this list is also published on the CLA website and is added to from time to time).

Except those works listed in the 'List of Excluded Categories and Works' (as published on the CLA website) and those works published by publishers listed in the 'List of Excluded US Publishers' (as published on the CLA website).

Please note the license does not cover native digital material eg, electronic journals and material available on the Internet.

Scanning for teaching purposes

The Licence also permits some copyright material to be made available in digital format to students through the virtual learning environment (Moodle). The School must keep detailed records of all items scanned under this licence, therefore a central processing and scanning service is operated by the Library. This part of the Licence largely covers UK publishers and a more limited number of international publishers

If you wish to make digital copies available to students on a course of study you should contact epacks@lse.ac.uk for further details about the service. Please note departments **should not** prepare/distribute scanned extracts of copyright protected material without submitting requests to the Library. If you do so, you and LSE are exposed to the risk of infringing copyright law.
