- ❖ Not just a sportsground!
- ❖ We believe strongly that the environment should be looked after.
- ❖ The lower sections of the grounds are managed in an environmentally friendly manner with grasses and wildflowers allowed to flourish. This acts as a buffer zone between the sports surfaces and the small river that runs adjacent to the fields. No chemicals or fertilisers are used in this area at all.
- ❖ An area of wildflowers is seeded annually attracting many insects, bees and butterflies.
- ❖ There are numerous mature trees around the grounds and hedges have been planted around the surrounds.

- ❖ We have a large range of wildlife living in and around the grounds.
- ❖ Birdlife ranges from dozens of Rooks and Seagulls through to more exotic Parakeets, Little Egrets and Owls.
- ❖ Foxes and Squirrels are also here in large numbers with the Foxes having many cubs annually.
- ❖ The wild areas of the ground attract a wide variety of bees butterflies and insects.
