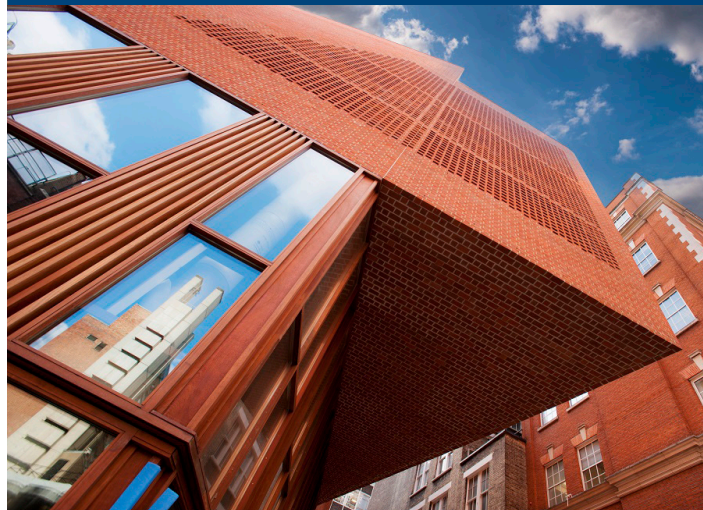

Welcome to the August edition of the monthly newsletter from the London School of Economics and Political Science Saw Swee Hock Student Centre.

PROJECT AND PROGRAMME

The project edges closer and closer to completion by the day. The external façade is complete, and the last of the remaining scaffold is being struck and taken out the gate. This week and next we have a visiting mobile crane on site to install the canopy above the building's main entrance, and ground build-up works to the external areas are ongoing and will be up until the last few days of the project.

Internally, each floor is awash with activity as the project drives forwards. The project has well over 150 operatives a day all carrying out various trades ranging from floor laying, decorations and joinery works to toilet cubicles, lift installation, and photovoltaics. As we move into September, floors will be completed and areas offered for final inspection as we fast approach completion.

MINIMISING DISRUPTION

As the project moves closer to the end, deliveries are becoming smaller but more

frequent. We appreciate that this has an impact on our neighbours and surrounding residents, particularly with the amount of small deliveries throughout the day. We would like to thank you once again for your patience regarding vehicle movement into and out of site, and we endeavour to manage this to avoid any nuisance to you.

We are particularly aware of the increased need to reduce any nuisance to surrounding neighbours and businesses. We are continuing to plan ahead with various subcontractors and suppliers, and maintain a close relationship with the Local Authority and the LSE regarding our strategy that will produce the least amount of nuisance as possible to you. The designated site working hours are 8am-6pm Monday to Friday, and 8am-1pm on Saturdays.

KEEPING UP TO DATE

Our **monthly drop in** day remains on the first Friday of every month, with the next one scheduled for **Friday 30th August 2013 between 2pm and 3pm**, so please feel free to join us in the Osborne project office – which is situated on the first floor of the Parish Hall – to discuss anything of interest, to look at the project itself or just meet the site team over refreshments.

CONSIDERATE CONSTRUCTORS

The site has been registered with the Considerate Constructors Scheme (CSS), which will mean that how we interact with our neighbours and operate our site will be regularly assessed by an independent body.

For the third time on the project, the site team has scored 37 out of 40 on the Considerate Constructors Scheme, reaffirming the position of the project within the top 10% in the country.
