PROJECT AND PROGRAMME

As the piling enabling works progress, we are able to start the piling to three elevations of the building. This is the formation of the new basement, and once complete will allow us to excavate to the new basement level.

There have been some unforeseen works to do with the Peacock Theatre boundary wall that has required a lot of time and attention. Every effort is being put in by the site team to resolve this with minimal disruption to both neighbours and the users of the Theatre.

MINIMISING DISRUPTION

It is inevitable that our construction activities may cause you some disruption, thus we will continue to work closely with the School

regarding our strategy that will cause the least amount of nuisance as possible. Just a reminder that our allocated noisy works times are: 8am-10am, 12-pm-2pm and 4pm-6pm.



CONSIDERATE CONSTRUCTORS

The site has been registered with the Considerate Constructors Scheme (CSS), which will mean that how we interact with our neighbours and operate our site will be regularly assessed by an independent body.
