### PROJECT AND PROGRAMME


The removal of the basement slab and removal of arisings remain the key activity. Once complete, the pile enabling works for the formation of the new basement will commence in earnest. These activities are carried out under an Archaeological watching brief by the Museum of London Archaeologists, who have already unearthed a palio channel which dates back to Saxon times.

### MINIMISING DISRUPTION

We acknowledge that the breaking out of the basement slab this week has caused disruption. We are looking to complete this as quickly as possible and thank you all for your patience and understanding.

We will continue to liaise with the School and community regarding our strategy that carry out our works so that there is minimal

disruption to all. Noisy works will be carried out within the restricted hours of 8-10am, 12-2pm and 4-6pm to cause the least amount of nuisance as possible. Working hours are 8am-6pm Monday to Friday, and 8am-1pm on Saturdays.
