PROJECT AND PROGRAMME

Since the last newsletter the new basement is beginning to form, and we are now able to get an idea of the footprint of the New Student Centre. We appreciate your patience with us as the substructure works progress. There have also been unforeseen water ingress issues with the Peacock Theatre, so we are working closely with the School to devise a strategy to urgently resolve this. This will require a lot of time and effort, so we hope that any disruption remains to be kept to a minimum.

The next month will see us begin the main excavation of the basement. To do this, extensive propping systems will be installed to support the new basement walls. Activity on site will remain busy with a lot of heavy

machinery. We will continue to endeavour to keep any disruption to an absolute minimum.
