

LSE CURIA GRANT

for a study visit at the Court of Justice of the European Union

Application deadline: Friday 28 April 2023

LSE Law School is delighted to announce that it has decided to fund one study visit at the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) during the 2023/24 session. Successful applicants will work at the chambers of an Advocate General for up to three months in periods subject to the CJEU's availability. They will receive a stipend from LSE of €1,377 per month as a contribution to the cost of living while in Luxembourg and a lump sum of £400 for their travel costs. Financial aid for covering the costs of medical insurance may be available, where needed.

CJEU Study Visit Programme

The Study Visit Programme was established to enable citizens of EU and, where appropriate, non-EU Member States to enable them to deepen their knowledge of the functioning of the Court of Justice and of European Union law. Visitors will be hosted by the cabinet of one of the members of the Court – in the case of the LSE Curia Grant, an Advocate General – and will work under their supervision for a period of up to three months. The visitors can expect to attend the Court's public hearings, research, and write memorandums on legal questions or factual aspects of the cases pending before the Court. Work may also involve assisting the Advocate General with other duties.

A visitor can only be received in this capacity once at the Court. A study visit cannot be immediately preceded or followed by a traineeship.

Application Criteria

- Open to current LLM or PhD students from LSE Law School and recent graduates.
- Excellent results in legal studies, including in courses specifically relating to European Union law.
- Excellent reading, writing, and oral skills in English. A working knowledge of French is an asset.

- Cover letter explaining the candidate's interest in and qualification for the position.

- The names and contact details of two academic referees, one of whom must be permanent academic staff at the LSE Law School. There is no need to submit full references at the initial application stage.
