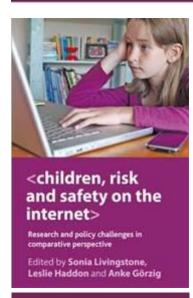

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EU Kids Online seeks to enhance knowledge of European children's use, risk and safety online

Released today

New Report: Policy influences and country clusters: a comparative analysis of internet safety policy and implementation:

- Maps internet safety policy and implementation in our four country clusters
- Reveals a divide between parts of Europe that enjoy better or lesser public support for internet safety.
- Finds that 'Unprotected networkers' and 'Semisupported risky networkers' country clusters display uneven commitments, with lower levels of investment, coordination and public sector involvement.
- Recommends that support for a broad and coordinated spectrum of activities involving multiple stakeholders and using diverse methods is vital.
