## **Funding and Financial Support**

LSE offers over £11.5 million annually in financial support for its students via a range of scholarships, bursaries and award schemes. Approximately 20% of taught master's offer holders are successful in obtaining some sort of financial support from the school.

## **Taught master's funding**

There are a range of awards available for study at this level. The value of support can range in value from 10% of the tuition fee, to a full fees and maintenance award.

Support is available for the majority of programmes through the Graduate Support Scheme (GSS), country and subject-based awards, Master's awards, Anniversary Scholarships and LSE Access to Education Graduate Scholarships.

If you haven't already done so, you can apply for funding via the Graduate Support Scheme through your LSE for You (LFY) account – you only need to apply once to be considered for all awards except for some country/programme based awards, please do check the <u>Fees and Funding pages</u> for full details of each award.

If you are unsuccessful in obtaining GSS funding, your details will be kept on file for consideration for any eligible awards being offered by LSE.

## LSE Access to Education Graduate Scholarships

LSE has significantly increased its funding for scholarships for asylum seekers and refugees, in response to ongoing crises.

For 2018 entry, ten awards are available to cover tuition fees and maintenance for offer holders meeting <u>these eligibility</u> requirements.

### **External funding**

There are also many external organisations that may be able to offer you funding to support your graduate studies, and we recommend that you explore as many options as possible.

Make sure you check the terms and conditions of any scholarship before you accept it. Take a look at the **External Funding Opportunities** tab for advice on where to find external funding.

## PhD funding

For 2018 entry, LSE will offer over 100 major studentships to new PhD students in the form of LSE PhD Studentships and LSE ESRC Studentships.

### Take a look at the Funding from LSE for research

**programmes** tab for advice on the value and terms of these studentships.

Academic departments nominate students for consideration by a School panel. There is no separate application for these PhD studentships. To be considered for this funding, you must have submitted your complete application for admission to LSE by a specific date, which varies by department.

## **Tuition fees** Your tuition fees will be detailed on your official offer letter.

You can choose to pay your fees in instalments; if you choose to do so the first instalment of at least 34% for September starters will be due on, or before, the 28th October 2018.

You can pay all or part of your tuition fees ahead of registration if you wish. The payment link is found in your <u>LSE for You</u> account.
