LAST CHECKS BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL

Monday 18th September marks the beginning of Welcome Week.

We look forward to seeing everyone on campus!

Before Welcome Week, you can prepare by checking for outstanding items so that your registration goes smoothly:

Make sure you have accepted your offer and submitted your Financial Undertaking Form before you get here! You can do this through your [LSE for You account](#).

Your LSE network account and email are now available, so please log in to the [application tracker](#) and follow the link to activate your account.

While you are logged into your account, make sure to check that we have received all of your documents. If any are outstanding you will need to have submitted these before you can register, so make sure you do this as soon as possible. If you present your hard copy documents in person at registration instead of sending them, please bear in mind, this may result in short delays of up to three working days.

For those of you that registered early for pre-sessional programmes there may be things that you haven't yet managed to do, such as activating your IT account, opening a bank account, or getting a UK mobile phone.
