### **Course Information: January Exams**

Some courses will have a summative examination in the week of **2-5 January 2018**. This allows assessment to occur immediately after the conclusion of the associated teaching and helps to spread the assessment load over the academic year. January examinations count towards the final course mark and students registered on these courses must be in attendance at the School to sit the examination at this time.
