

LSE Widening Participation and your data: full statement Year 8 and below

Why are you collecting my data?

The LSE Widening Participation team collects data about people who come on our projects so that we can understand who we're working with, run our projects safely, and see whether we are making a difference.

We will use your data to run the project, and then to do some research about how the project affected you. Once we've done this, we will delete anything that could be used to identify you (for example, your name and your date of birth).

If you're on Promoting Potential, we will also give your name, date of birth, current school and postcode to the LSE undergraduate admissions team. This means that, if you choose to apply to LSE when you finish school, the team will know that you took part in one of our intensive projects.

We might publish reports based on the data you, and everyone else on the project, share with us, but it will never be possible to identify you in the reports.

Any data you've previously shared with the LSE Widening Participation Team will also be covered by these conditions from now on.

We will never share your data outside the LSE Widening Participation Team.
