



International Relations perspectives for an Ivy League university

Enriching experience and broadening outlook at LSE

For over a decade, students from Dartmouth College have come to LSE for an annual 10-week Foreign Study Programme organised in collaboration with LSE Custom Programmes. Aligned with LSE's Michaelmas Term, the programme allows participants to immerse themselves within one of the most cosmopolitan centres in the world. Coordinated by both LSE and Dartmouth professors, the term spent at LSE carries credits for the Dartmouth degree.

During their time at LSE, the students attend lectures at the International Relations and Government Departments. Topics such as Strategic Aspects of International Relations, Government, and Politics and Public Policy in the European Union offer both regional and global expertise and perspectives. The programme is led by at least two LSE academics, who also run a series of private seminars and tutorials to supplement their lectures and provide a venue for more interactive discussions and debates. Dartmouth academics accompany the students, offering another stream of lectures and seminars to link the LSE components to the home degree programme.
