International Political Economy at LSE

LSE Custom Programmes, part of LSE Enterprise, has welcomed its first cohort of over 50 students from the Instituto Tecnológico Autónomo de México (ITAM) for a three-week programme in International Political Economy. The undergraduates received a mixture of specialist lectures, private seminars and corporate visits, covering the themes of the global economic outlook, emerging economies, and global trade and regional integration. They were taught by LSE academics from the European Institute and the Departments of Government, International Relations and Media and Communications, as well as an array of external experts.
