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Global Dimensions Programme

Academic teaching and professional development for UEM students

Recognising the need to equip students with professional development skills, the Universidad Europea de Madrid (UEM) requested an extended programme of classroom learning and practical work experience for 35 final-year undergraduates and recent graduates from European Laureate International Universities.

The programme, now run on an annual basis from January to July, is divided into three parts to structure students' learning. It is designed to address the gap between theory and practice.

Students initially spend ten weeks on an academic programme, tackling modules on Global Business Dimensions, Strategic International Marketing and Economics in Global Public Policy. The second section allows students to explore how to apply their knowledge through modules on Project Analysis and Professional Development. Finally, they put their learning into practice and gain valuable international work experience while completing a twelve-week internship.

In addition, students attend LSE Public Lectures by many notable speakers, including George Soros and Professor Lord Nicholas Stern.
