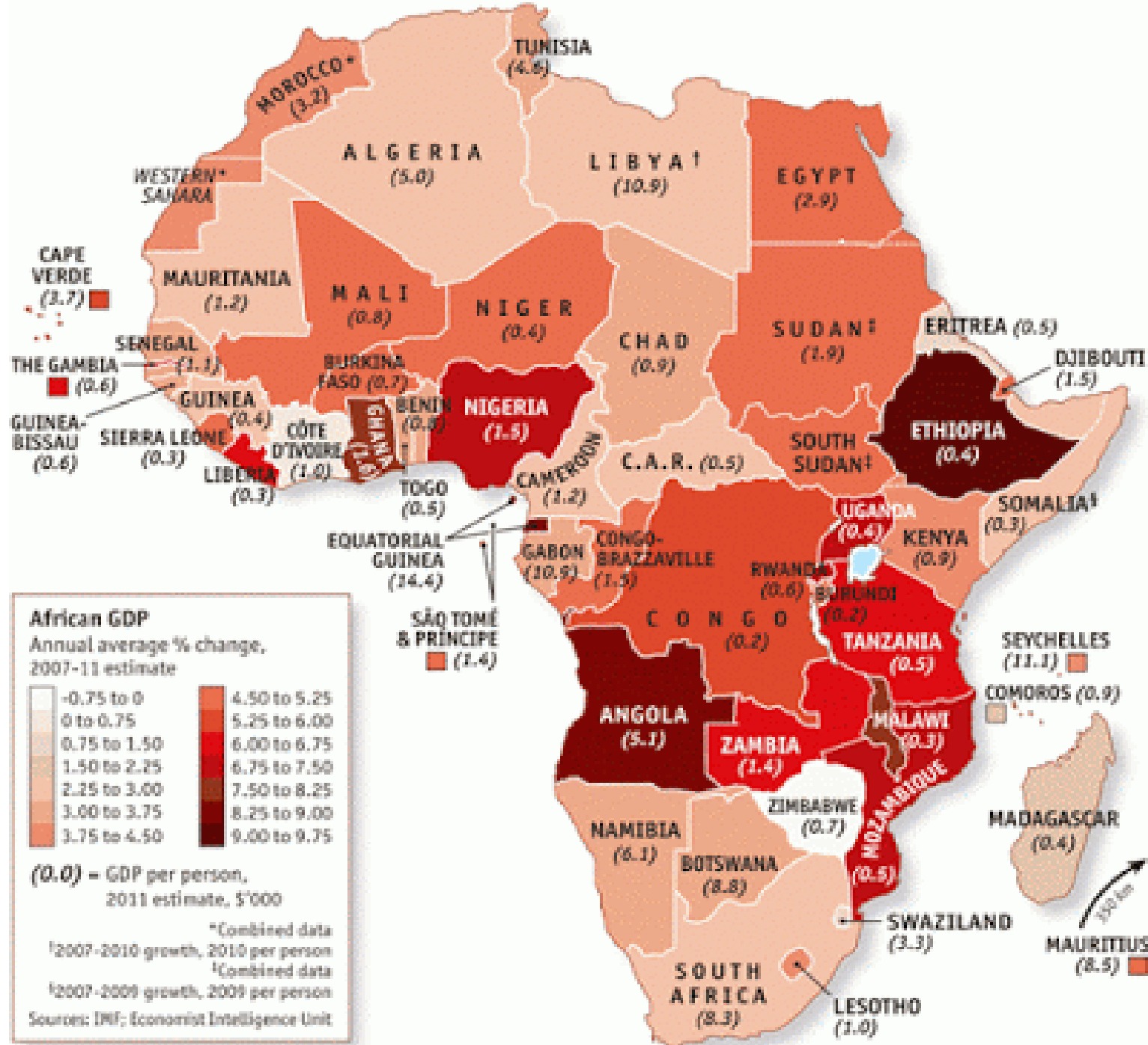

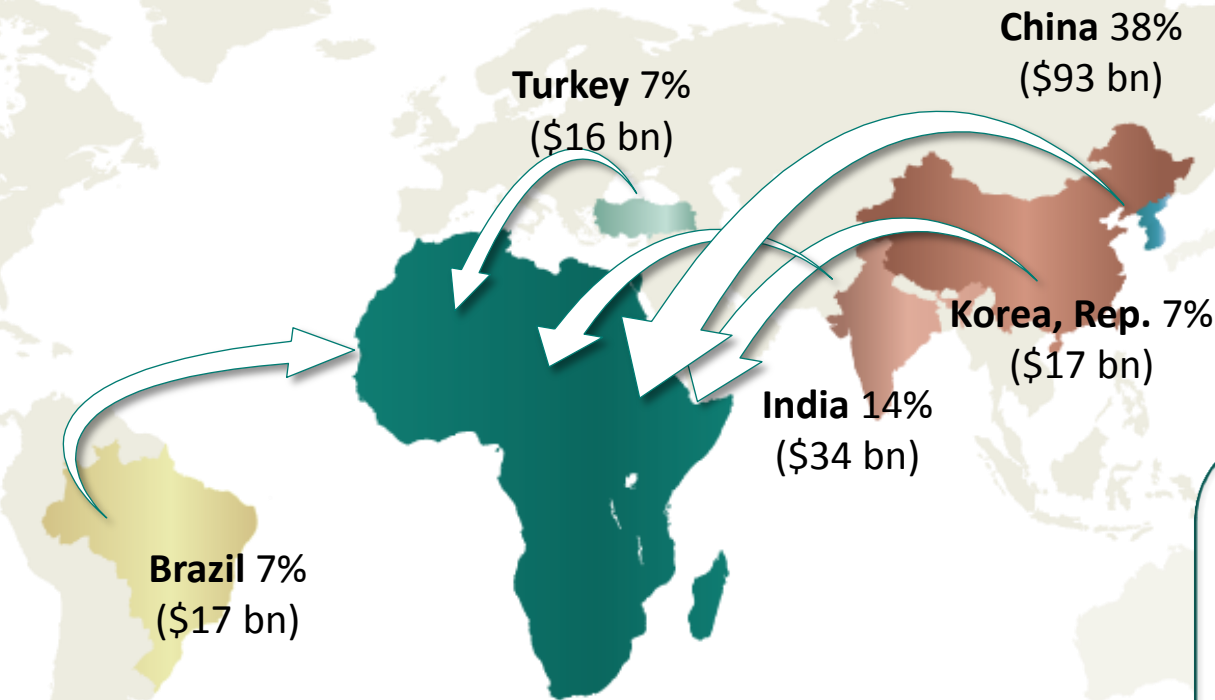

Africa's Emerging Partners



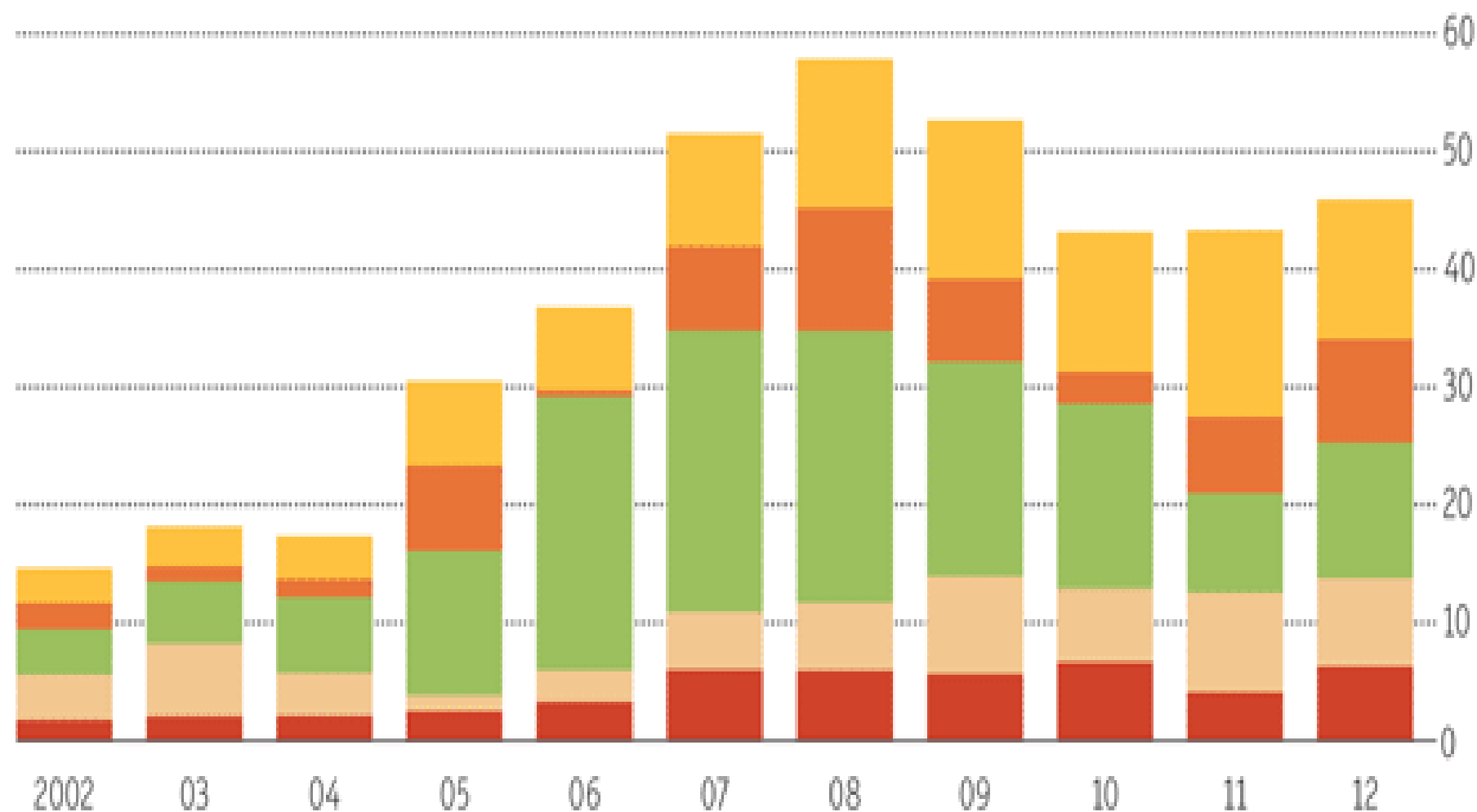
Africa Trade Volume, 2009 % of total (US\$ billion)

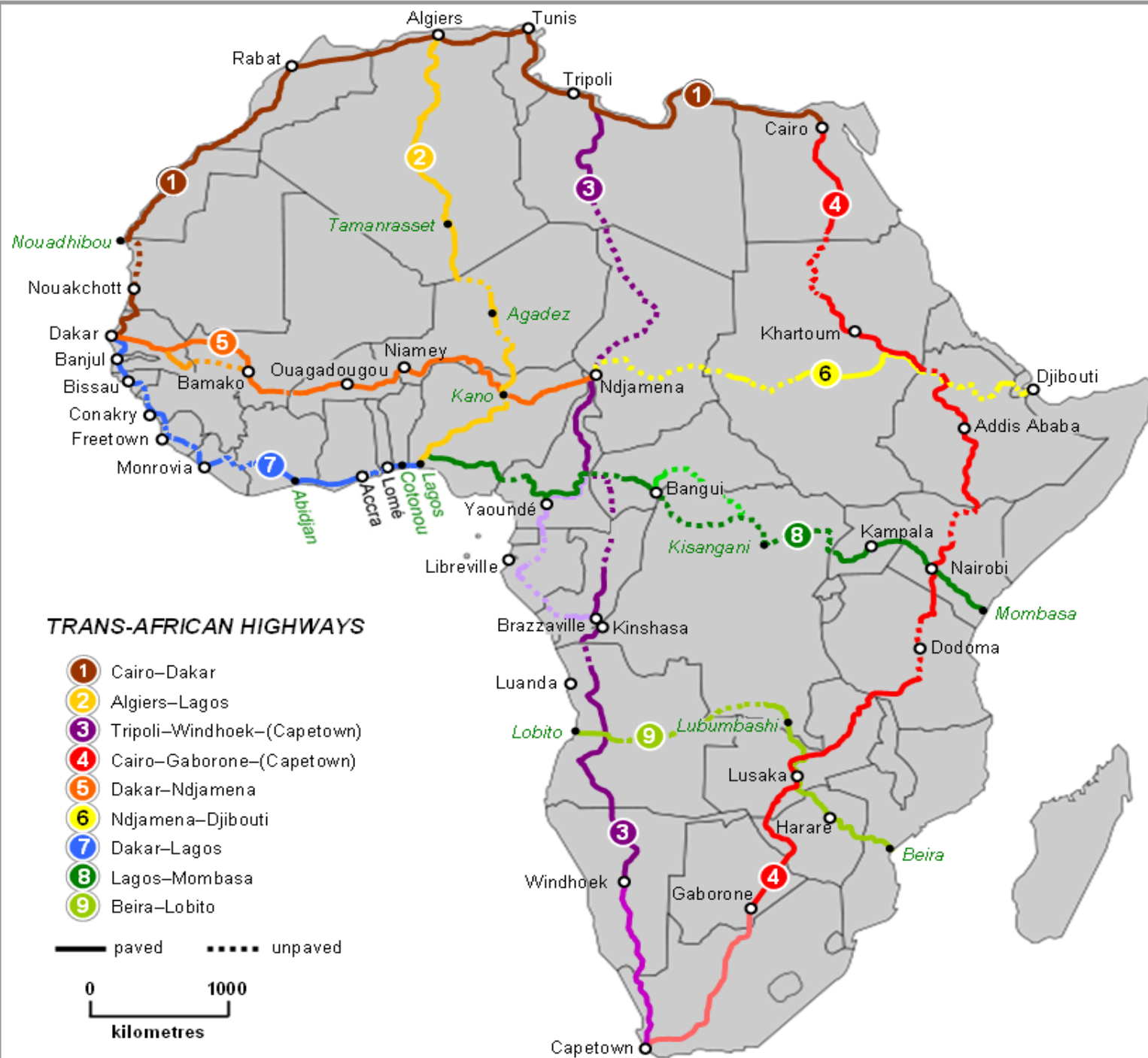
Foreign-direct-investment
flows into Africa, \$bn*

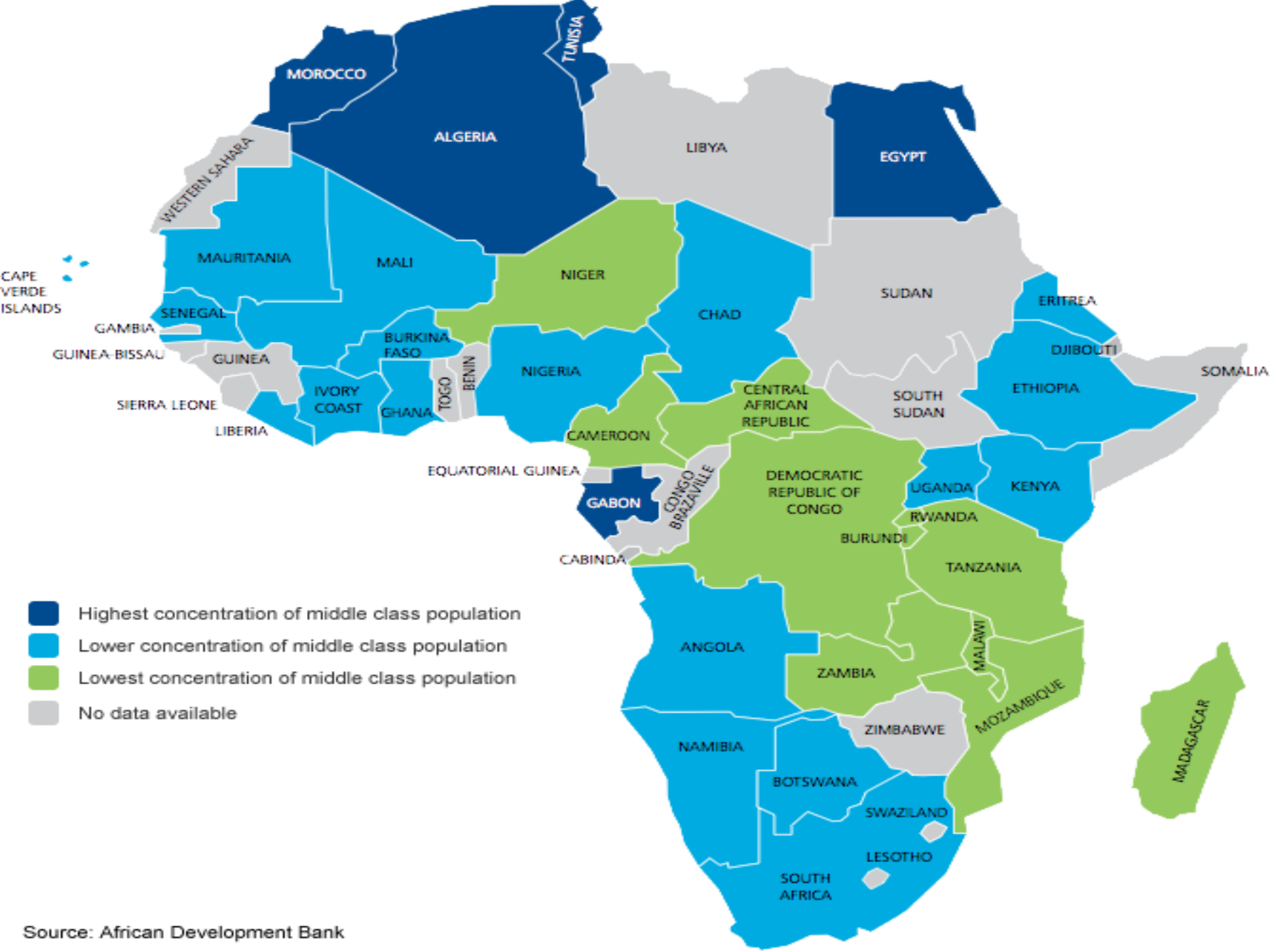
Western Southern Northern Central Eastern

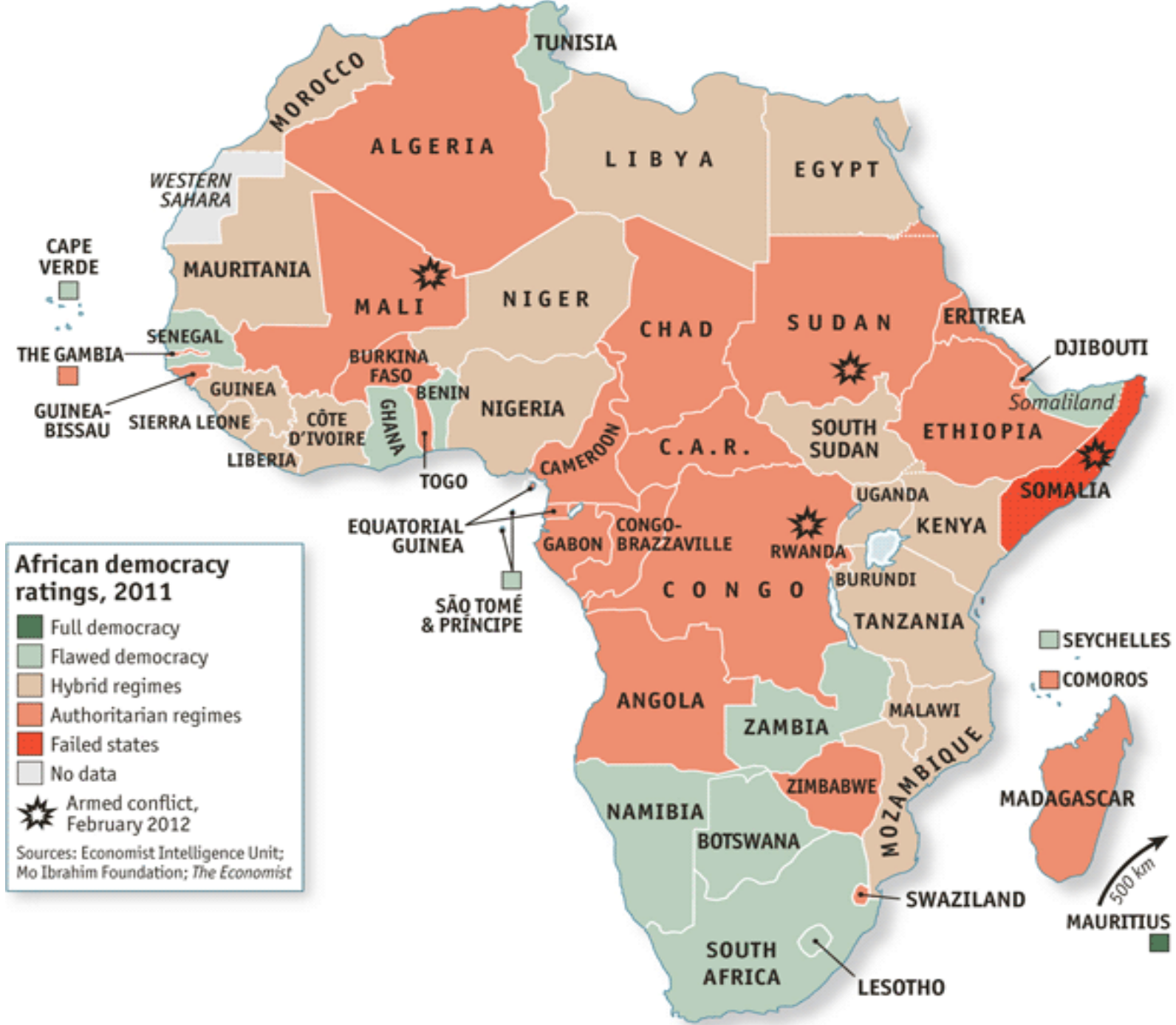
