Meeting the conditions of your offer

There are several steps you may need to take over the coming months to fulfil any conditions or requirements of your offer. We need to receive official proof that you have fulfilled these and we advise that you act as early as possible to avoid running short of time later in the summer.

Please remember that if you require a student visa to study with LSE, you will not be able to apply for this visa until your offer is fully unconditional and has been firmly accepted via UCAS track

If your offer is conditional

If you are sitting overseas qualifications you will need to send us certified verification of your results as soon as possible and no later than **1 August 2016**. Please see your [Offer Guide](#) or below for information on how to submit correctly certified verification.

If you are sitting the IB, A levels or other UK qualifications this year we are usually able to verify your results directly via UCAS, but we will request certified copies of your qualifications if we are unable to verify them.

English language conditions

If you have been asked to obtain an English language qualification please send certified verification of this as soon as possible and no later than **1 August 2016**. For information on the English language qualifications we accept please see your [Offer Guide](#). If you are taking an IELTS test please arrange to take this as soon as possible and once you have received the results email your TRF number to ug.admissions@lse.ac.uk

If your offer is unconditional

You may still be required to provide certified verification of your qualifications, and any such requirement will be detailed in your offer letter. Please send these no later than **1 August 2016**.

Providing certified verification

It is important that you provide correctly certified copies of your qualifications. Failure to do so can result in a delay in making your offer unconditional

We require photocopies of your qualifications to be validated by a teacher at your school or a British Council official and the photocopies must meet each of the following four conditions:

- Each page must be originally signed by your head teacher or other teacher from your school (or by a British Council official).
- The signatory must also print their name.
- The signatory must also include their job title.
- Each page must also contain the school (or British Council) stamp.
