



FAQs

Q: My topic is broad and I have only devoted a part to Greece and/or Cyprus. Am I eligible to apply?

A: Yes, you should just narrow down the topic of your presentation to Greece and/or Cyprus.

Q: How will I know my application's results?

A: We will let you know of our decision by 13 March 2023.

Q: Will the sessions take place at the LSE?

A: Yes, all the sessions will take place on the LSE's campus in London WC2A 2AE.

Q: Does the LSE provide accommodation for the participants?

A: Unfortunately, the LSE cannot provide accommodation. You will need to make your own arrangements. Suggestions for nearby hotels will be uploaded in the website soon.

Q: When do I receive the travel grant?

A: The LSE's Finance Department will process the reimbursement of all eligible travel grants as soon as possible after the Symposium has taken place. The payment normally takes up to 6 weeks to process.

Q: Do I need to send you my boarding pass in order to claim the travel grant?

A: No, there is no need to send us your boarding pass.





Q: May a friend or a relative come to attend the Symposium?

A: Yes, they can, but please send us an email with the visitor's name to hellenicobservatory.phd@lse.ac.uk so that we can prepare their name badge.

Q: How many words should my paper be?

A: The minimum number of words is 5,000 and the maximum is 8000 words (including the abstract). This does not include bibliographical references and diagrams/tables; these are in addition to the maximum.

Q: Do I need to send my final slide presentation beforehand?

A: Yes. This must be done by 19 May and you should also bring it with you in electronic form.

Q: How long does each presentation last?

A: Each presentation should last no longer than 10–15 minutes.

Q: When will the schedule become available?

A: We expect to have the final schedule available about a week before the Symposium.

Q: Is my attendance mandatory for the whole day?

A: Yes, attendance is mandatory for the whole day of the Symposium.

Q: Do I receive a certificate of participation?

A: You will receive a certificate of participation at the closing ceremony of the Symposium.

Q: Can I receive my certificate even if I do not manage to present my paper?

A: No, in order to receive a certificate of participation you must present your paper at the Symposium.
