# School Registration

# Friday 6th September, 12.00-12.30, Student Services Centre Atrium (SSC) (moved from Hong Kong Theatre venue)

You must register in advance of the pre-sessional course. # Pre-sessional Course (MA400) (compulsory)

# Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September - Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September, 11.00am, Room CLM 5.02

The MSc in Financial Mathematics starts with a pre-sessional course that **must** be attended by all students on the degree. The teaching on the pre-sessional begins on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> September and the course runs for *two weeks* until Friday 20<sup>th</sup> September. There will be a two hour examination covering the material studied in the pre-sessional course on *Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> September at 11.00am* (this is not a formal examination; you will receive a mark, but it will not appear on your transcript, or affect your classification. It is intended as a tool to provide you with feedback on how well you have understood the material covered). The pre-sessional course forms a vital part of the degree and it is *essential* that you are able to commit fully to the two weeks of teaching. In order for you to benefit from the course, this period should **not** be viewed as a time to arrange any other details of your study such as accommodation. The week following the pre-sessional will provide a chance to immerse yourself in the wider aspects of your time at LSE. You can find an outline of the pre-sessional timetable in this pack.

#### Preliminary Reading

If you want to do preliminary reading as preparation for the pre-sessional we can recommend the following: Shreve, Stochastic Calculus for Finance II Continuous-Time Models, Springer; and D. Williams, Probability with Martingales, Cambridge University Press.

You may also wish to familiarise yourself with the basic elements of programming with the C language. The textbooks we use are D.M. Capper, *Introducing C++ for Scientists, Engineers and Mathematicians*, Springer; B. Stroustrup, *The C++ Programming Language*, Addison Wesley; M. J. Capiński, T. Zastawniak, *Numerical Methods in Finance with C++,* Cambridge University Press; M. S. Joshi, *C++ Design Patterns and Derivatives Pricing*, Cambridge University Press;

Those who are already familiar with parts of C++ can start reading the book by B. Stroustrup, all others should start with the first chapters in the book by Capper.
