

Interdisciplinary workshop on: Translating Nature and Climate into Risk: Data, Measurement, and Decision-Making

The workshop aims to foster collective discussion around its core themes, rather than focusing solely on the presentation and discussion of individual papers. Presentations are therefore organised around thematic clusters (e.g., biodiversity tools, climate riskwork, governing nature objects, measuring nature objects) rather than as standalone paper sessions. Further guidance for presenters will be provided nearer the event.

The programme also includes a practitioner panel focused on tools and methods for addressing nature and climate risks, as well as sessions with single speakers that explore key challenges and opportunities in research on climate and nature risk.
