







Call for Applications

Writing Workshop for Ugandan and South Sudanese Early Career Researchers on the theme of

Public Authority In and After Peace

Successful applicants will be invited to attend a writing workshop in East Africa from the **last week of July 2019**. They will also receive additional support to facilitate the submission of an article to an international, peer-reviewed journal by the end of November 2019.

Applicants must be South Sudanese or Ugandan and will usually have a PhD or equivalent research experience. Applicants should **not** have numerous, previous academic publications. Applicants must have original empirical research in the Social Sciences or Humanities that they hope to write-up into an academic article of approximately 8,000 words to submit to a reputable, international, peer reviewed journal by the end of November 2019.

- An abstract and outline of their proposed article, including details of original research already conducted.
- A statement confirming that: i) they are South Sudanese or Ugandan; and ii) their research complied with usual ethical standards.
- A short curriculum vitae.

Places are limited. Applicants will be selected by a panel from the University of Juba, the University of Gulu and LSE.

The workshop is being held in partnership with The British Academy, The University of Juba, The University of Gulu and The Firoz Lalji Centre for Africa (London School of Economics and Political Science). The writing workshop is funded with support from the British Academy.
