On 31st August 2023, the Programme for African Leadership (PfAL) lost one of its own. Abdul - Malik Abdul -Latif was a 2020 PfAL alum whose passion for serving his community was evident in his words and actions.

Having dedicated over seven years of service to working in Ghana's health sector, Abdul-Malik was awarded the UK Government's Chevening Scholarship to study a Master of Science in Health and International Development at the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) in 2019. Subsequently, he worked on multiple research projects which were focused on developing positive outcomes in Ghana's health sector.

Most recently, Abdul-Malik worked as an Associate Researcher and Project Development Manager at Innovations for Poverty Action, a non-profit research and policy organisation. His academic and professional background are a testament to his commitment to help improve health systems, and support sustainable policies in Ghana. While at the LSE, he was intentional about building strong relationships with fellow Africans and inspired his peers to take initiatives that contribute to the development of the African continent. Abdul - Malik's passions were focused on health, education, poverty alleviation and empowering young people to become their best selves; this inspired the founding of Impact Aid Africa (IAA), a youth-led organisation aimed at empowering young people while "addressing humanity's most pressing needs in any little way possible".

Being a beneficiary of the Chevening Scholarship, Abdul – Malik introduced IAA's flagship project, the EduScholar Project, which since 2021 has provided mentorship to about 100 young people from various countries in Africa including Ghana, Nigeria, Sudan, South Africa, and Namibia. This mentoring programme has enabled some beneficiaries to secure global scholarships to pursue postgraduate studies in top universities in the world.

As the Founder and Executive Director of Impact Aid Africa, Malik believed that every young person deserved access to formal education regardless of their socioeconomic background; this, he sought to promote with the EduScholar project.

"This initiative is part of our commitment to unlock the potential of African youth through quality education, and we shall not rest until we achieve our goal of supporting 500 young people to apply and win postgraduate scholarships to study abroad"- Abdul-Malik Abdul-Latif.
