



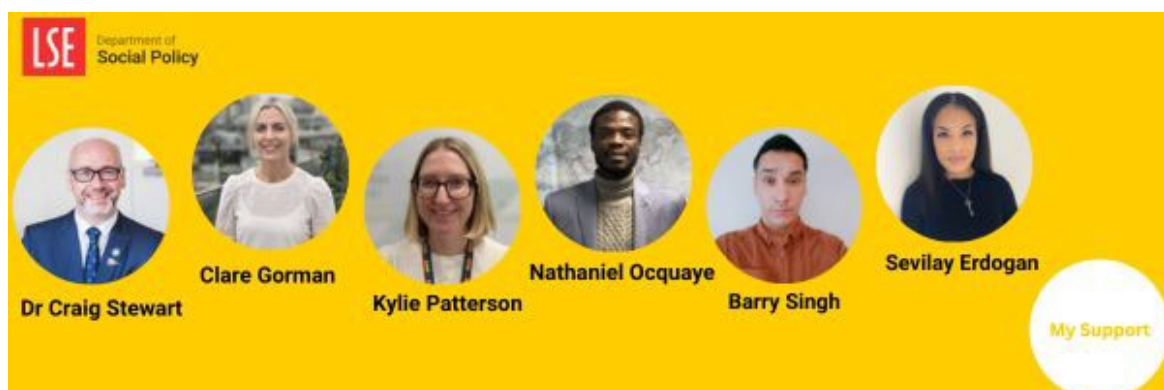

- Make a note of the [2026/27 term dates](#) – the LSE Academic year is divided into 'Autumn term' (from September to December); Winter term (From January to March) and Spring Term (From April – June).
