LSE Welcome 2026

The main LSE Welcome will take place from **Friday 18 September to Friday 25 September**.

You can now view the [2026 Social Policy Welcome schedule](#). Please note that while no registration is required for most sessions, some events will require you to sign up. [All details are included on the Welcome schedule](#).

Don't worry about having to remember everything in your Welcome sessions — we know there's lots of information to take in, and we'll always keep you up to date with all the key information you need to know! We'll also share recordings of key sessions after the events. However, if you'd like to bring a notebook or your laptop to make notes as you go along, so feel free to do so!

Enrolment

You can find all the information you need about completing your enrolment [on this webpage](#). Remember enrolling is a [two stage process](#) including online pre-enrolment and campus enrolment.

Campus enrolment will take place in the afternoon on Monday 21 September. Please refer to the [Enrolment Schedule](#) and attend the slot allocated for your programme. Enrolment will take place in the Marshall Building (MAR). The [campus map](#) will help you find your way around the School.

Enrolment is when you formally become a student at the School. It is vital that you [bring the correct documentation](#).

Programme Handbooks

In advance of your arrival, please [read through your Programme Handbook](#). This contains key information on your programme which you will find useful throughout your degree. Save it somewhere where you can refer to it as needed through the year — you'll find it invaluable!

Course selection

Course selection should now be open for new undergraduate students. You do not need to choose any courses in firstyear, as all your courses will be set 'core' courses in this initial year of study. However, you do still need to access LSE for You to 'save' these choices as your course selection.
