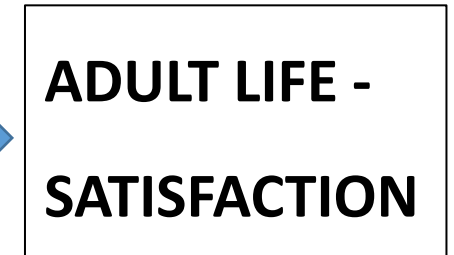

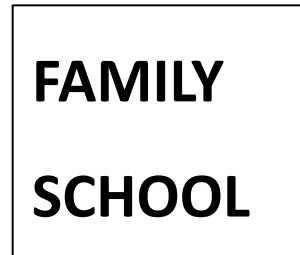

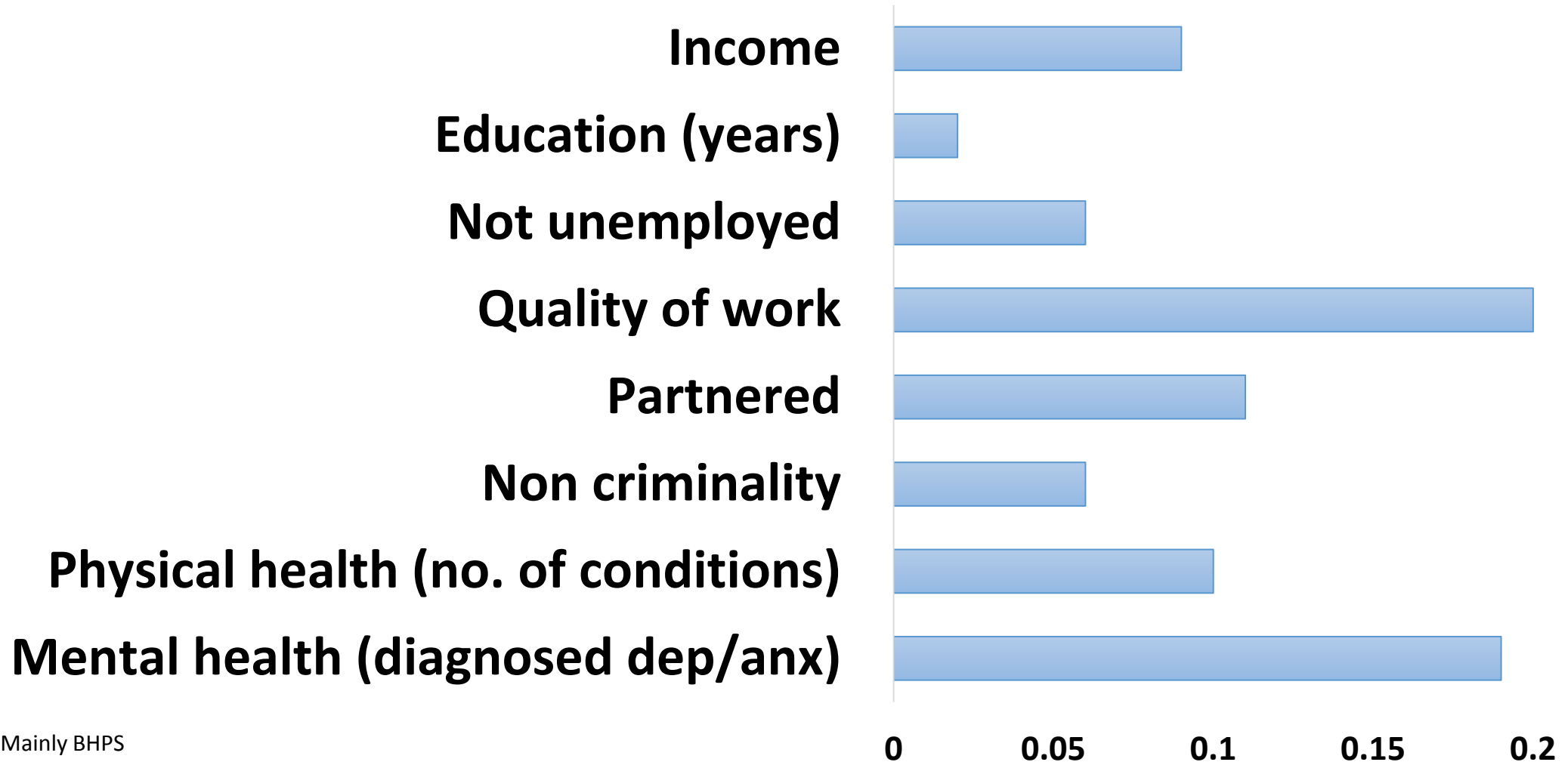


SURVEYS USED

- **Other rich countries**

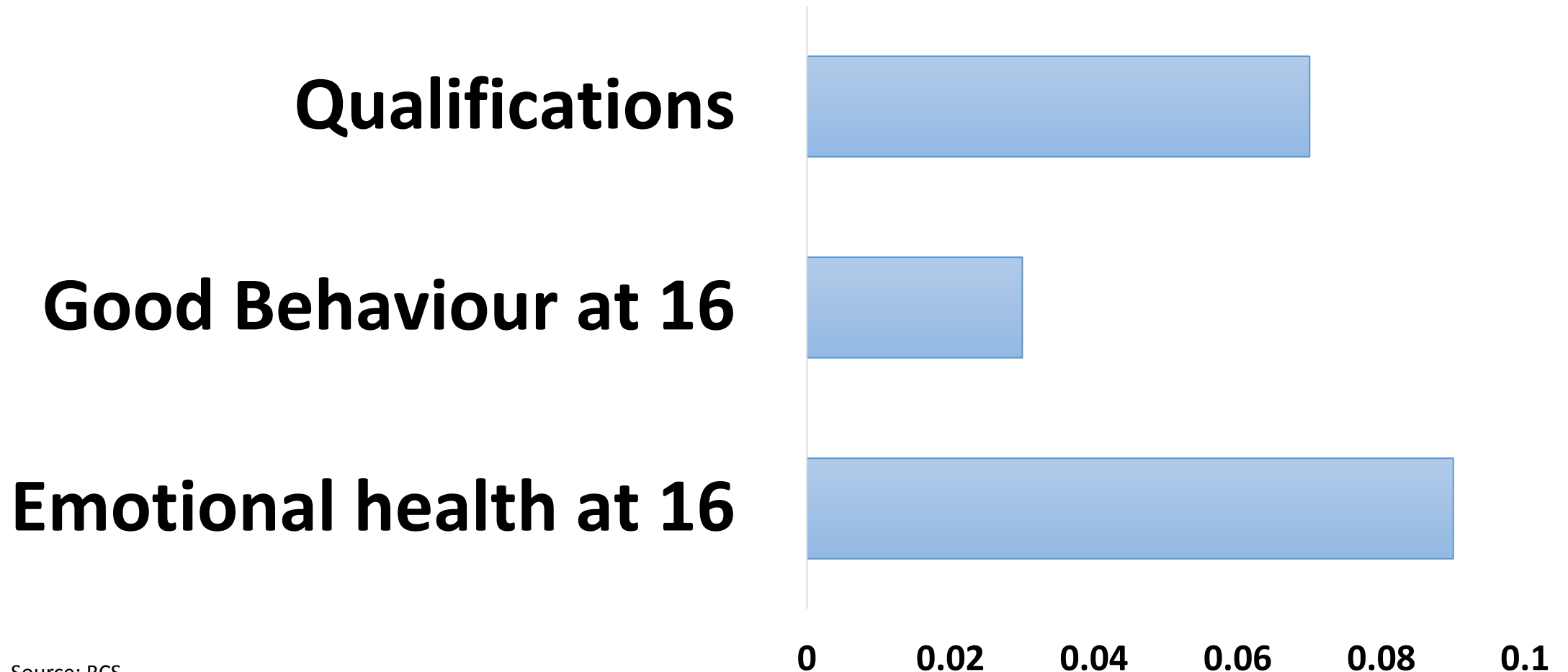
WHICH CURRENT CIRCUMSTANCES EXPLAIN LIFE-SATISFACTION?

(Partial correlation coefficients)



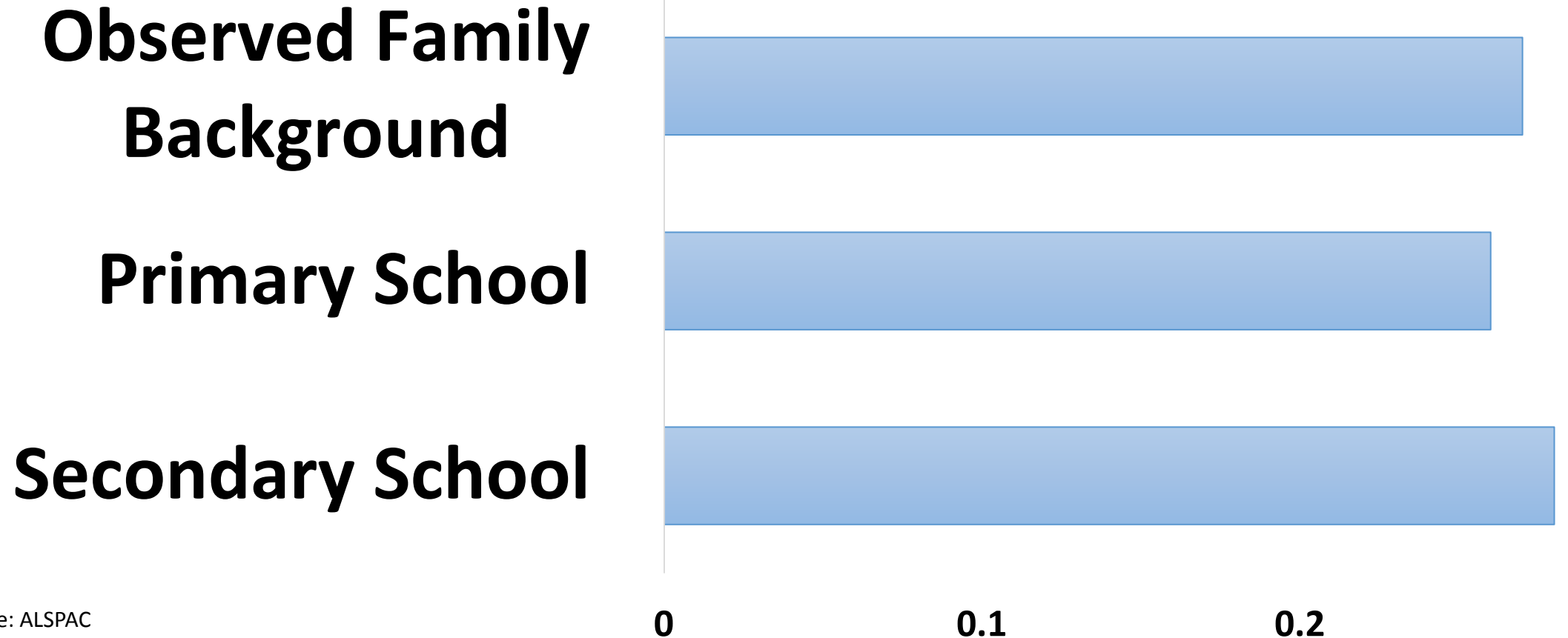
WHICH ASPECTS OF CHILD DEVELOPMENT BEST PREDICT ADULT LIFE-SATISFACTION

POLICY

Aim at greatest happiness (with extra weight to reducing misery).

- **More redistribution, due to declining marginal effect of income.**
- **More policies to help improve personal skills (mental health, parenting, partnering, helping others).**

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
