USING DATA FOR HOMELESSNESS AND ADDICTION INTERVENTIONS

People experiencing homelessness and addiction face significant barriers when trying to access residential treatment. But when it comes to recovery, there is a huge cost to doing nothing. These costs affect individuals and communities, and impact healthcare systems, social services and the economy.

Dr Michela Tinelli is working with various stakeholders to develop the Care Quality Evaluation (CQE) platform, a digital tool to enhance decision-making in health and social care. Michela has collaborated with the charity **The People's Recovery Project (TPRP)**, who are using CQE data to show local authorities and service providers the tremendous benefits of investing in residential treatment for people experiencing homelessness and addiction.

About the dashboard

Care systems are often disconnected, leading to wasted resources and poor patient outcomes.

The CQE platform provides a continuous flow of real-time data to inform better decision-making.

Users can monitor care provision, compare care to national benchmarks, and track the economic impact of recovery interventions on public budgets and society.



BEFORE TREATMENT

The true annual cost

It costs the government **£568k** to support **10 PEOPLE** experiencing homelessness and addiction for one year before they receive help.

This includes spending on benefits, healthcare, housing, social care, and more.

GOVERNMENT COST FOR 10 PEOPLE BEFORE TREATMENT

£1.24m

ANNUAL COST TO SOCIETY TO SUPPORT 10 PEOPLE

The total annual societal cost is higher, including all public spending, the cost of drug and alcohol use, and work productivity.

PUBLIC BUDGET SPENT ON HEALTHCARE FOR 10 PEOPLE

Following treatment, healthcare costs are reduced to **£25k** annually, a saving of **£135k**.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION COSTS FOR 10 PEOPLE

“ The amount of money that it costs to keep me alive on the street, I could be going to treatment for a year. ”

PUBLIC BUDGET SPENT ON CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM FOR 10 PEOPLE

Money for drugs and alcohol is often raised through criminal activity, producing further costs in criminal damage.

AFTER TREATMENT

Annual savings and reallocatable resources

Accessing treatment reduces the government spend for **10 PEOPLE BY 76%**, thanks to better health, stable housing, zero criminal justice costs, and other positive impacts.

£138k

GOVERNMENT COST FOR 10 PEOPLE AFTER TREATMENT

£50k

SOCIAL GAIN FOR 10 PEOPLE FOLLOWING TREATMENT

This gain is driven by reduced public costs, a **100%** drop in drug and alcohol consumption, and increased work productivity. All costs are fully offset by the productivity gains, leaving a net social benefit of **£50k**.

PRODUCTIVITY GAINS

Increased productivity – through returning to the workforce by volunteering, paid employment or supporting others.
