

Undergraduate programmes summary of actions taken to address matters raised at SSLC meetings

Term	Matter raised	Action
Autumn term 2023-24	Students would like to see a greater sense of community and more social events.	The department is involved in the Student Academic Mentor Programme (SAM), a scheme designed to build integrity and collegiality – a student to student mentoring initiative where second and third years are trained to mentor first years to help them settle in and meet new people. This will be promoted again in Winter/Spring term for 2024-25. A variety of events have been planned for the academic year now that we have an events person in post again. The events coordinator is always happy to promote and support events on behalf of the History Society. It was noted that the Society is run by students in their spare time with limited funding.
Autumn term 2023-24	Some students noted that they were unaware of the marking criteria at UG level.	The marking criteria is detailed in the programme handbook. Every student received a link to the handbook and it is also available on each of the Moodle course pages. In future this information will be highlighted in first year courses and feedback meetings.
