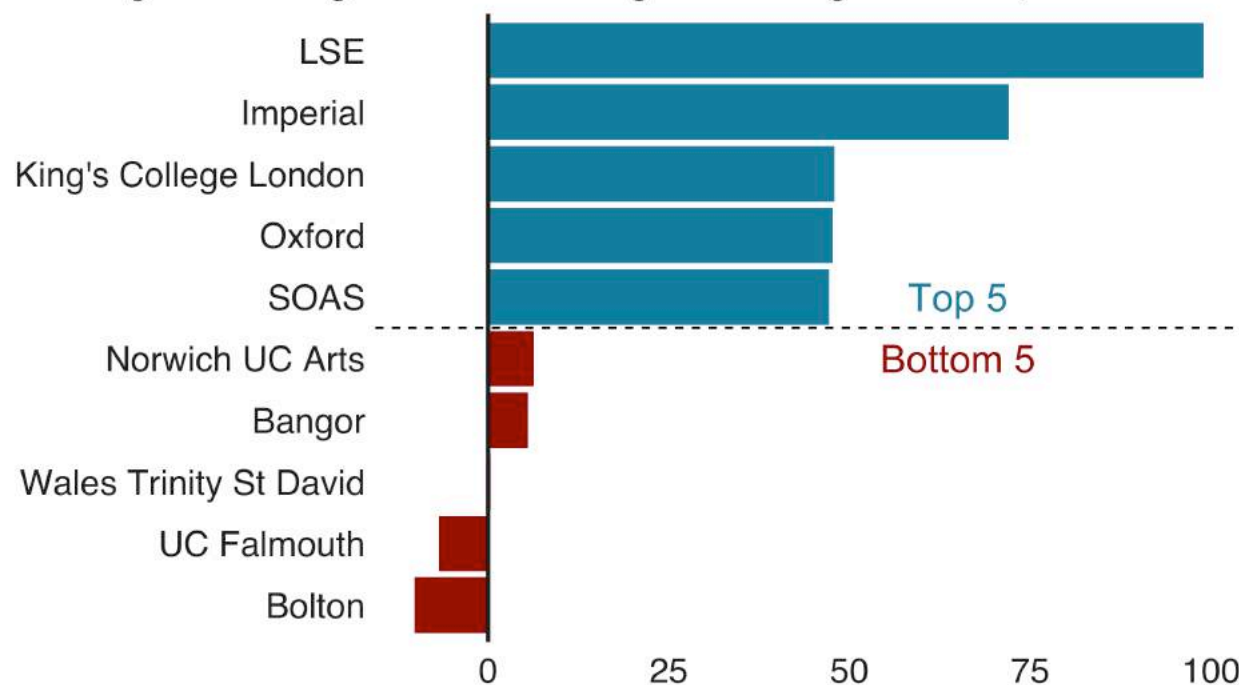

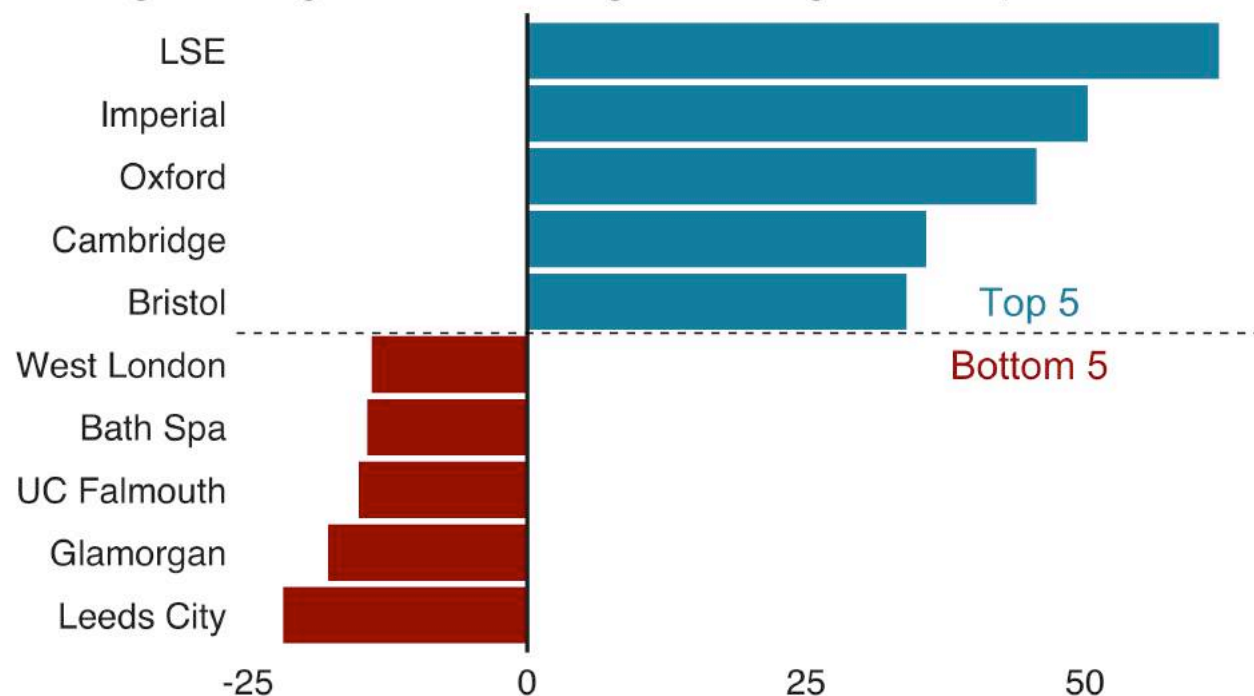
Average female graduate earnings vs non-graduates, %

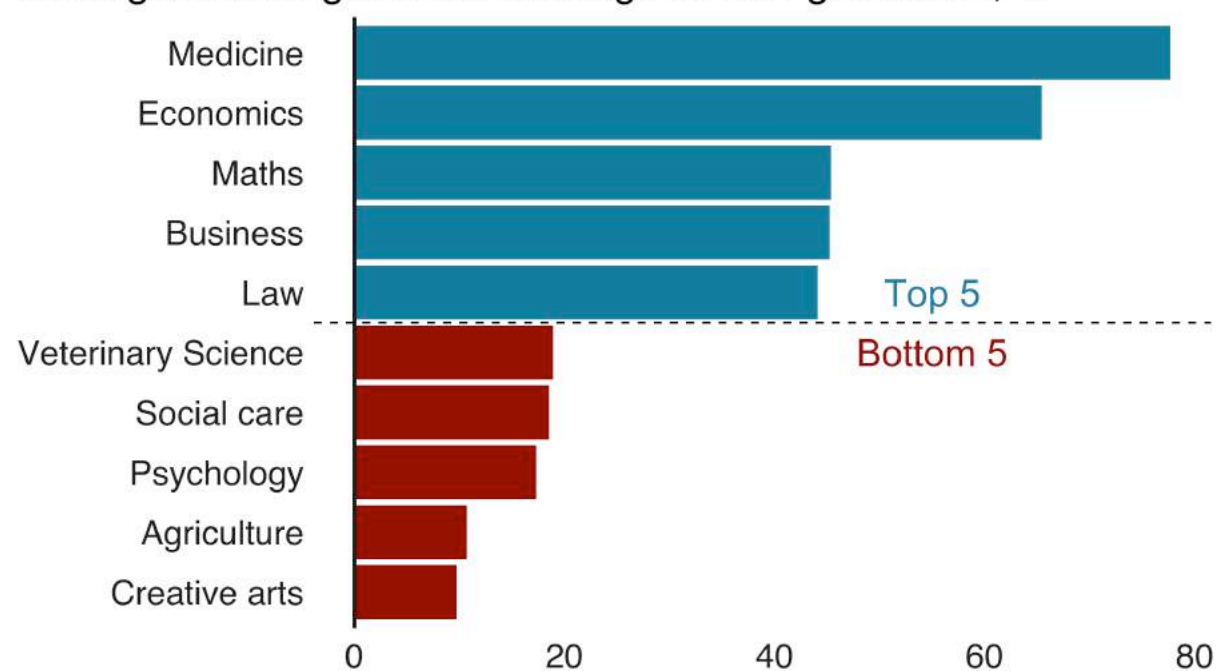

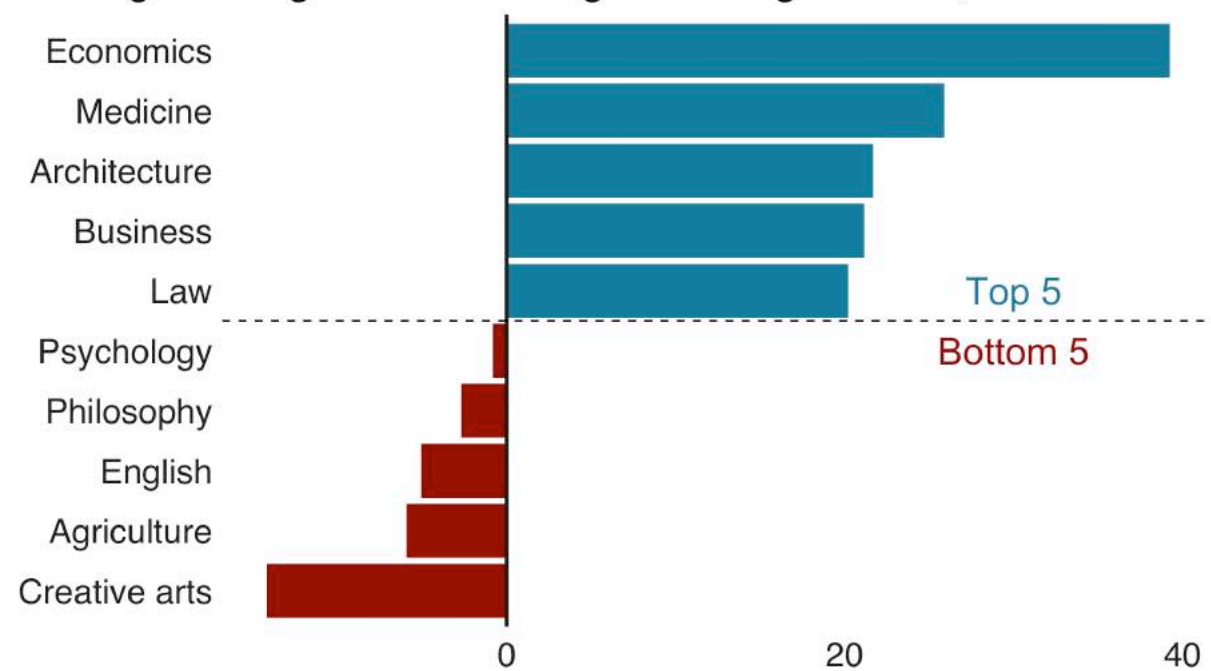
Average female graduate earnings vs non-graduates, %

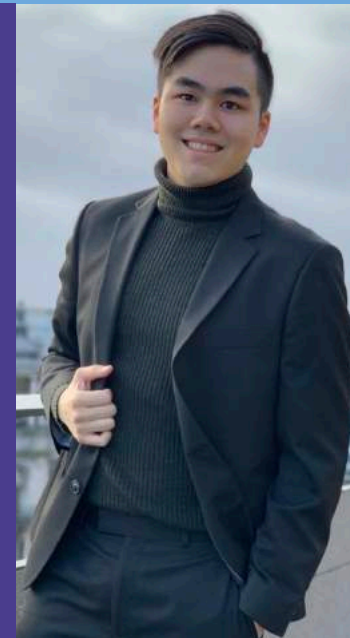
