Economics in Joint Degrees and other programmes

- A joint degree combines courses from two different Departments into one degree (PPE from three)
- Structured to complement each other and form a coherent sequence
- A joint degree combines the subjects 50/50: e.g. BSc ... and Economics
- Economics can also be studied as a minority subject in proportions
 75/25: e.g. BSc.....with Economics
- Students on many other programmes also study Economics at LSE e.g.
 BSc Finance, BSc Accounting & Finance

Joint Curriculum Highlights

- Separate (Year 1 and 2) core courses for students on the BSc
 Economics and students on other degrees studying economics
- Core courses tailored to the specific needs of different students
- Rigorous, up-to-date and policy relevant.
- Excellent preparation for Year 3 for all.



How do students benefit?

- You take courses with a more homogeneous group of students
- Tailored courses to better match your interests and career objectives
- A quantitative and non-quantitative track with scope to switch between the two (joint degree students must follow the quantitative track)
- Joint Degree students take Microeconomics, Macroeconomics and Econometrics; better preparation for Year 3 courses.
