

An exploration of the multifaceted opportunities and challenges globalisation brings to Europe.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

- Interdisciplinary knowledge and an understanding of culture and conflict, drawing on political, global, social and philosophical thought.
- The capacity to analyse European debates and policies on culture and conflict in a global context.
- Key courses include: The Culture of European Politics, Culture and Security in Global Politics, and Democracy, Ideology and the European State.

MSc Political Economy of Europe

A historically grounded, multi-disciplinary analysis of key political and economic processes and problems in Europe.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

- Knowledge and understanding of the interaction between the economy and politics in Europe and its international context.
- The ability to identify the drivers behind the processes of European integration and fragmentation, and the institutions governing these processes.
- Key courses include: Political Economy in Theory and History, Political Economy of Integration and Fragmentation in Europe, and Concepts in Political Economy.

MSc European and International **Public Policy**

A multi-disciplinary analysis of contemporary European politics and public policy, including its impact on Europe, EU member states and the broader international system.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

- A deeper understanding of the wider domestic and international processes and effects of European integration and policy-making.
- Development of your professional skills for careers with government organisations, NGOs or the private sector.
- Key courses include: European Policy-Making and International Cooperation, and Evidence and Analysis in Policy-Making.

MSc International Migration and Public Policy

A unique range of courses that will deepen your knowledge of public policy responses to international migration issues at the local, regional, national and global levels.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?


- A deeper understanding of the major historical and contemporary debates about international migration, and the ways that migration poses challenges for public policy matters.
- How to analyse the relationship between migration, globalisation and public policy.
- Key courses include: International Migration and Immigration Management, International Migration and Migrant Integration, and International Migration: EU Policies and Politics.

MSc European Studies (Research)

A methodologically and historically grounded, multi-disciplinary analysis of Europe as a political, economic and cultural space.

WHAT WILL YOU LEARN?

- Substantive themes in European integration and disintegration, with a strong emphasis on methodological training.
- Both quantitative and qualitative methodology, and how to apply them robustly throughout your research process.
- Key courses include: European Policy-Making and International Cooperation, Political Economy in Theory and History, The Culture of European Politics, and Foundations of Social Research.

The European Institute offers bespoke two-year double degree programmes with three different global partners. These select programmes are delivered by world-leading experts in their fields.

Double Master's Degree in

European Studies

Spend your first year in **Paris** at Sciences Po, studying Master Affaires Européennes (Master of European Affairs) and your second year in **London** in the European Institute at LSE, studying either Culture and Conflict in a Global Europe, Political Economy of Europe, or European and International Public Policy.

Double Master's Degree in

Global Political Economy of China and Europe

Year one of the programme takes place in **London** in the European Institute at LSE, where you will study the Global Political Economy of China and Europe. For year two you will be at Fudan University in **Shanghai**, where you will study Public Policy.

Double Master's Degree in

European and International Public Policy and Politics

Your first year is spent at Bocconi University in **Milan**, where you will study Politics and Policy Analysis. Your second year will be in **London** at the European Institute at LSE, where you will study European and International Public Policy.


