Feminist Movements Around the World (FMAW) is a community creating a transnational network of solidarity between feminist movements. Through collective learning, FMAW builds a fertile ground for support between feminist and social movements. Within this open platform, people exchange knowledge and practices, promoting the emergence of new political narratives.

Born as a strategy to reclaim the sharing spaces that were lost to the COVID-19 pandemic and to the inability universities to provide an online alternative to these

The dynamic is simple:

each week, someone prepares a short presentation about a movement or social uprising in their home country + a moment for questions, sharing experiences

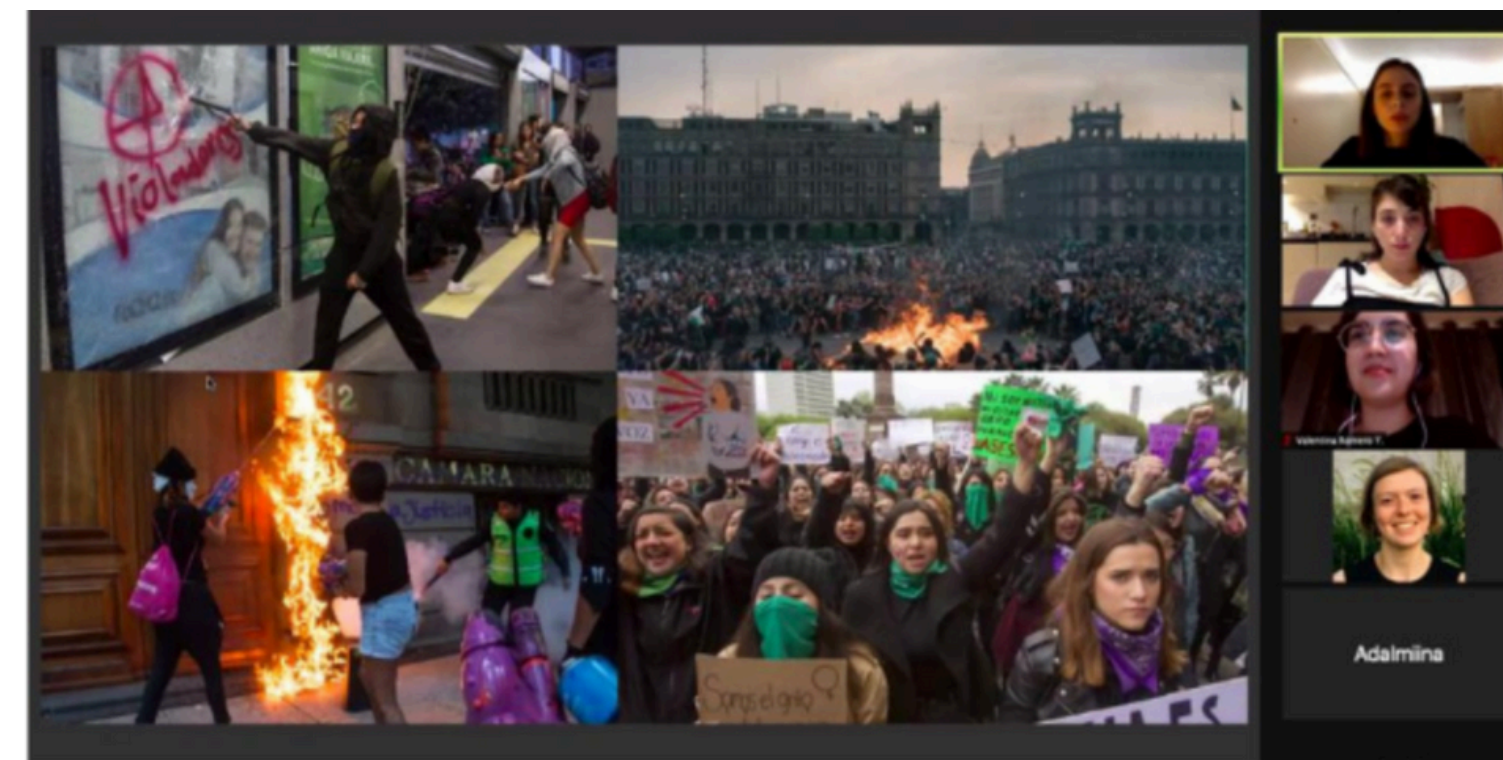
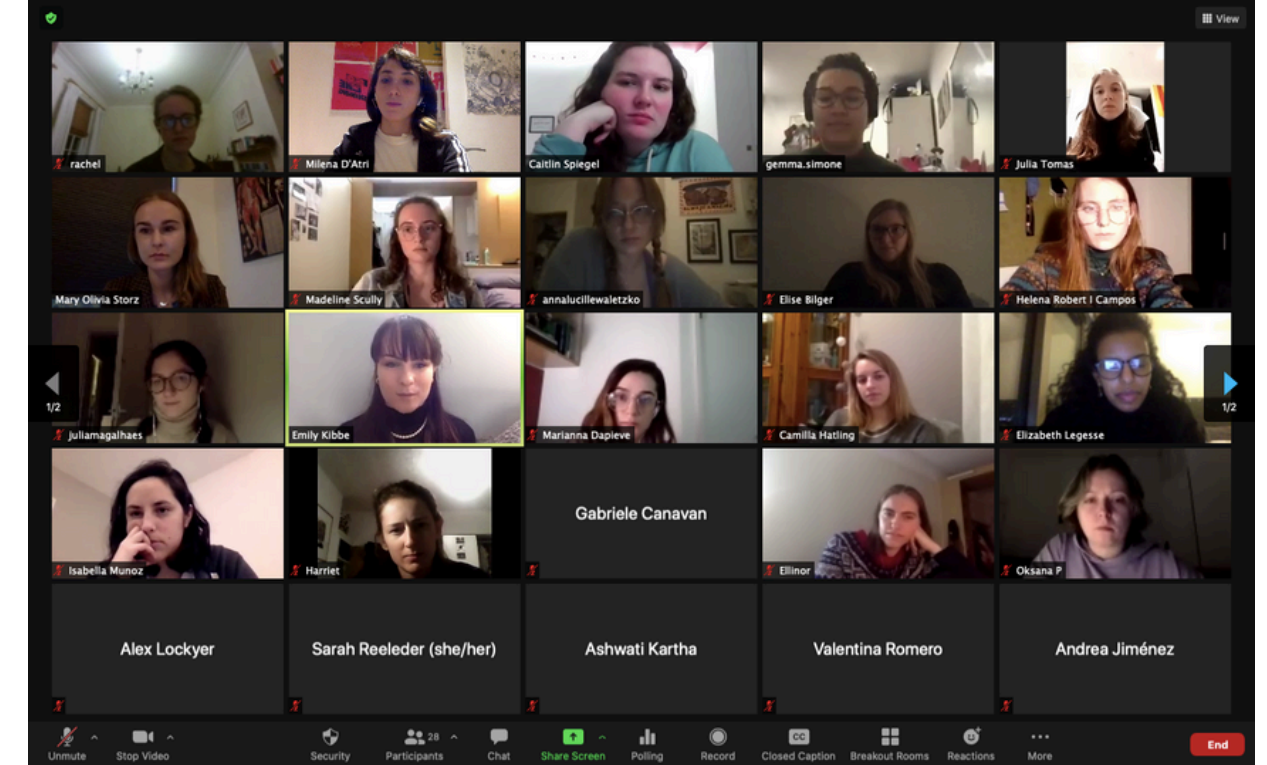
Started by Milena D'Atri- MSc Gender, Policies and Inequalities 2020/21 cohort.

Founded the initiative and led it in 2021/22, 2022/23, 2023/24, 2024/25



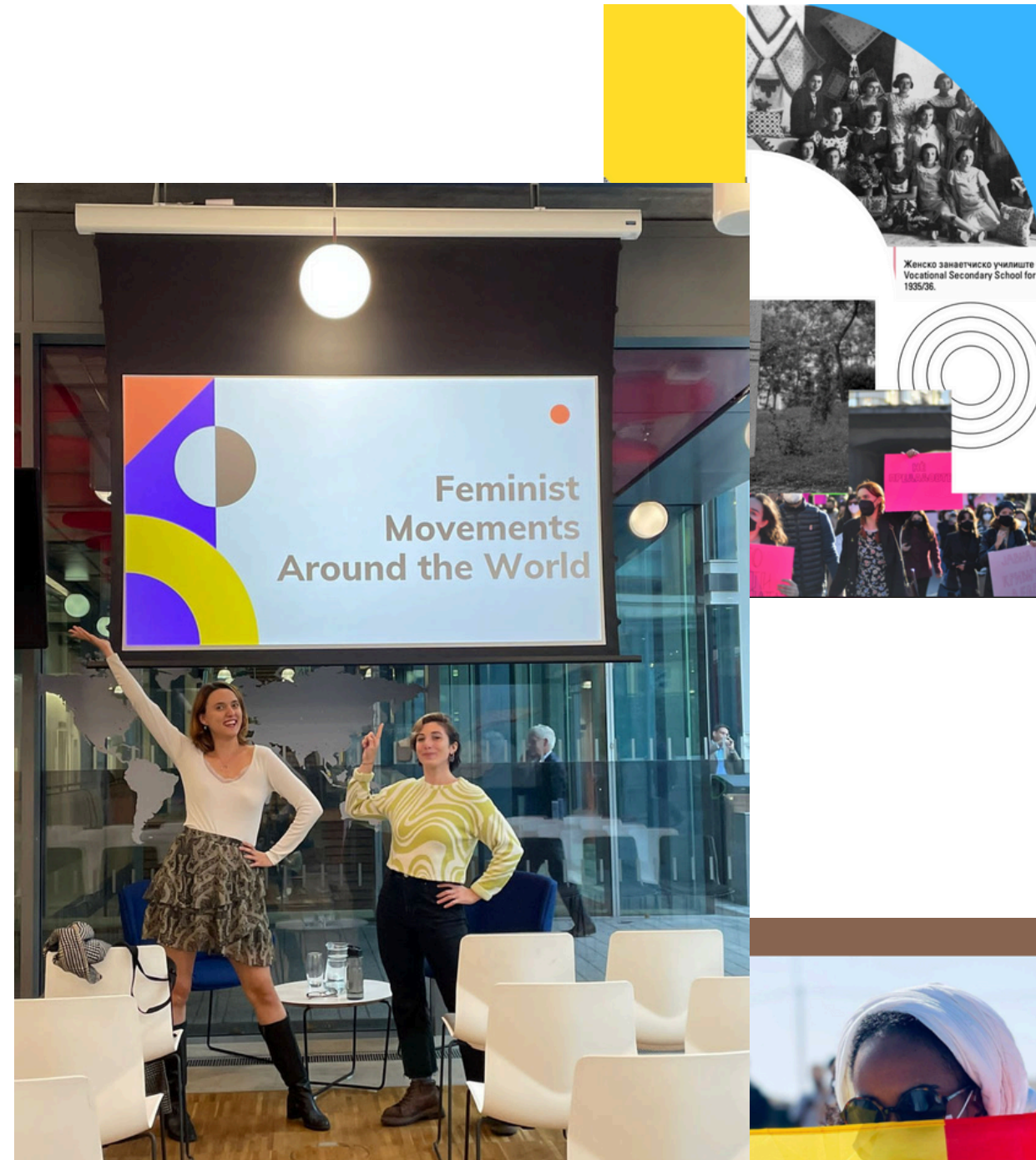

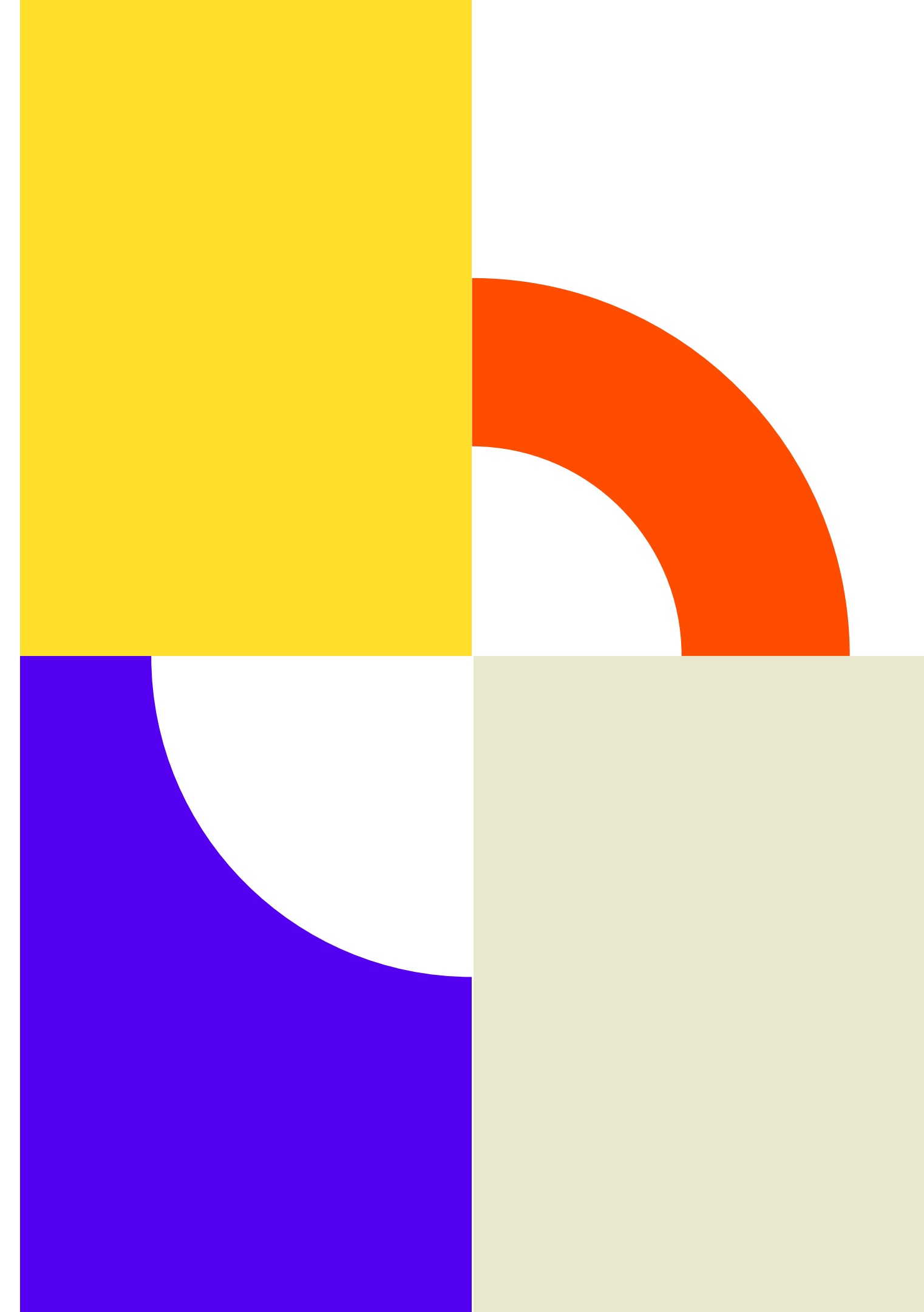
- Context

- Dilemmas? Outcomes?

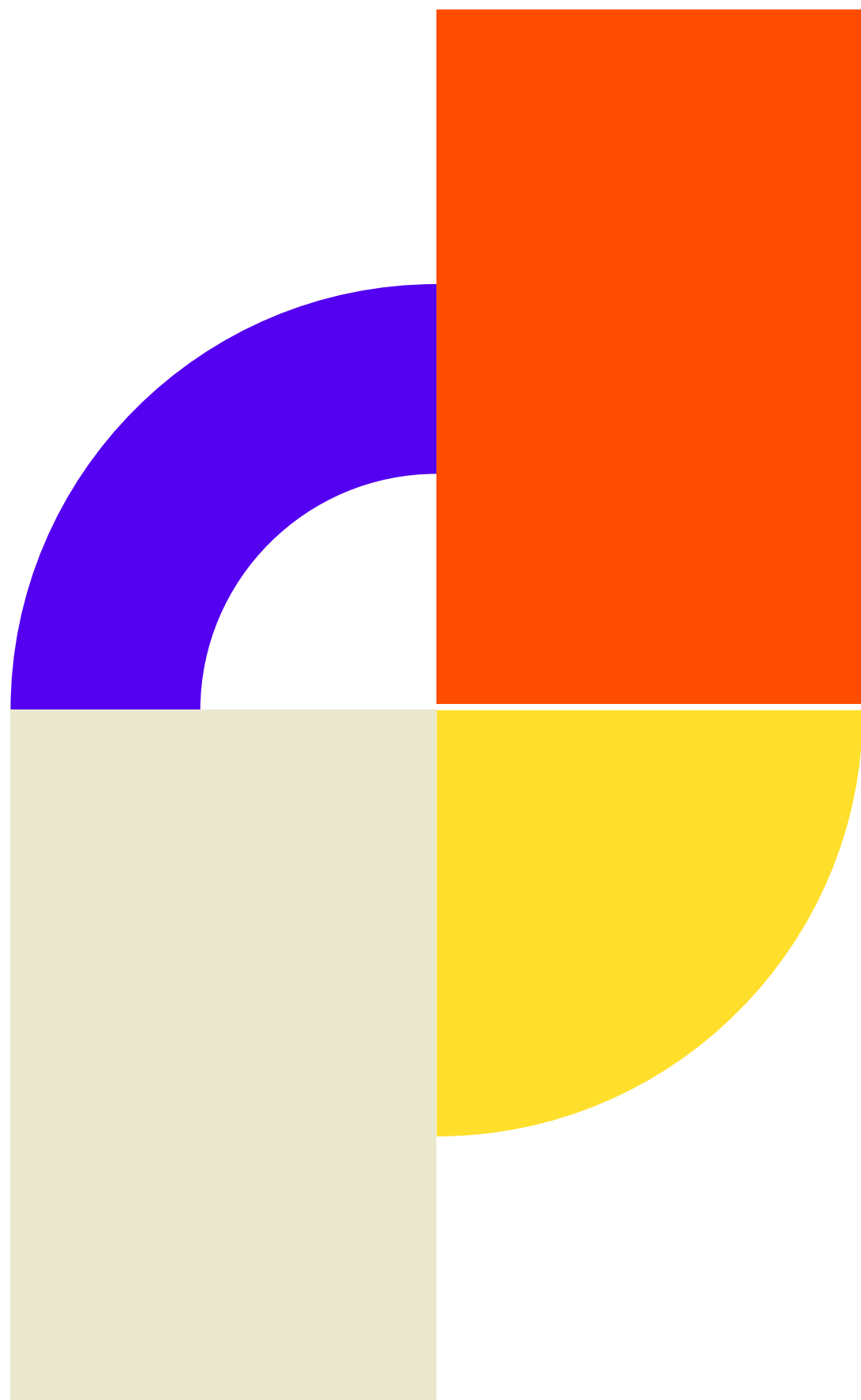
