# Call for Papers

We invite proposals for the **Michaelmas Term** period of the 2021-2022 academic year's LSE-Sciences Po Seminar in Contemporary International History (HY510). The seminar welcomes presentations from faculty and PhD students at any institution on any aspect of **20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> century contemporary international history, broadly defined.**

The seminar is an ideal environment to share works-in-progress, such as PhD chapters, journal articles, or sections of monographs and books by providing a forum for the discussion of new research by PhD students, postdoctoral researchers, and faculty members from across the world. All seminars will be held **in-person as hybrid sessions when possible, but otherwise will take place on Zoom on Wednesdays, 4-6pm in London, and on Wednesdays, 5-7pm in Paris**, between October and December 2021. Two seminars during this term will be joint LSE-Sciences Po sessions on Zoom.

Presenters will be asked to submit a 15-20 page paper ten days before their presentation, to be circulated to participants beforehand. Presentations will be 20-30 minutes and are followed by a Q&A discussion.

Applicants are welcome to apply to both the London and Paris seminars and should submit a provisional title, a brief (one-page maximum) abstract, and a CV by **Friday 20 August**.

Those interested in presenting in either London or Paris are invited to complete **this form**.

Applicants applying to both the London and Paris seminars must indicate a preference for presenting in either Paris or London on the application form.
