Specialisms

MSc Development Studies, MSc Development Management, MSc International Development and Humanitarian Emergencies, MSc Health and International Development only

Students who choose to concentrate their electives and dissertation in a certain topic area may elect to have a specialism in "African Development", "Population Studies" or "Applied Development Economics" attached to their degree certificate and transcript. To obtain the specialism indication, students must meet the criteria below.

- African Development: students must take DV418 and DV435, and their dissertation topic must be approved as being appropriate for this specialism.
- Population Studies: students must take DV444, or DV456, and their dissertation topic must be approved as being appropriate for this specialism.
- Applied Development Economics: enrolment capacity is limited and may be based on performance on a pre-quiz which will enable them to take at least two of DV490, DV491*, DV492, and their dissertation topic must be approved as being appropriate for this specialism.
