Frequently Asked Questions EPID:

- 1. Which courses can I take as electives? You can take two half unit electives and at least one of them will have to be in the Department of International Development. We have a <u>list</u> of pre-approved courses and would encourage you to approach the course instructor early on in the term to secure a place on each course.
- 2. How can I prepare for my dissertation/empirical paper? DV494, DV495 and DV496 will help you develop a feasible research design for your empirical paper. You will have several opportunities to present your ideas, preliminary research and preliminary data analysis in DV496.
- 3. How should I select a research topic for my empirical paper? There are many different ways in which you can identify an interesting and viable research question. Good starting points would be the syllabi of the DV49* courses, as well as Evidence Papers (IGC, JPAL) that summarize frontier research on different topics. Reviewing articles from the Journal of Economic Literature or the Journal of Economic Perspectives can also be a good source of ideas.
- 4. How can I identify good sources of data for my empirical paper?

- **5. Do I have to use STATA in my empirical research?** While there are many advantages to being proficient in STATA to understand economic research (which still uses predominantly STATA) you are welcome to use R or Python as needed.
- 6. Do we have seminars in DV490, DV491, DV492, DV494, DV496 in the first week of term?
