Then, about a decade later, its apparent passing was declared. In this lecture I will examine the current world of low fertility, and ask what happens when fertility rates go 'lower than lowest-low'. I hope to present an alternative set of perspectives on how we label and reframe (very) low fertility, and how we might better respond to it from both within 'traditional' population policy as well as broader reforms of prevailing social, cultural and economic institutions.
